1. GGAC appreciates the VA's commitment to the aging Veteran population and research and strongly recommends the area of Aging, Geriatrics, and Geroscience be one of the Portfolios in the Office of Research Development (ORD) reorganization. Given its cross-cutting nature, GGAC believes it could be a Broad Portfolio, but if not, at least a Managed Portfolio. In addition, regardless of other aspects of the reorganization there should be consistent aging research expertise presence on the review committees.

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ORD is working with multiple program offices, including Geriatrics and Extended Care (GEC), as they examine how current research resources are utilized and develop portfolios that reflect VA priorities. Aging has been combined with Medical Health research in a broad portfolio. Additional funding for aging investigators may be found in another broad portfolio focused on Brain and Behavioral Health. The tentative organization of this work was piloted in FY 2023 and is set to implement in FY 2024. Evaluations will be ongoing to assess efficiency, cost and effectiveness of the new organizational design.

2. GGAC recognizes the challenges in bringing on a new EHR and recommends that broad input be sought from programs such as the GRECCs, MIRECCs, COINs, and other VAMCs with strong research programs and special clinical program development as the new EHR structures are considered. The initial pilot VAMCs did not have such programs. Input on the unique clinical and programmatic aspects of geriatric care is critical in providing high quality care to the older Veteran population.

The Committee's attention to the research mission in the context of EHRM is appreciated. The GEC EHRM Council began working with the Geriatric Research, Education, and Clinical Centers (GRECC) on the capabilities needed by GRECCs in 2019, and escalated efforts after Mann-Grandstaff VA Medical Center (Spokane) transitioned to the new Federal Electronic Health Record (FEHR), in late 2020. For the reasons delineated, when it became evident that the

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required capabilities were not available, the GEC EHRM Council reached out to Mental Health; the Mental Illness Research, Education and Clinical Centers (MIRECC); Neurology for Parkinson's Disease Research, Education, and Clinical Centers (PADRECC); and the Research Council. The GEC EHRM Council led a cross-council effort and submitted a New Service Request (NSR), in December 2021, on "Local agility and flexibility needed in the FEHR for innovation, quality improvement, clinical demonstrations, and research." In February 2023, through the cross-council prioritization process, this NSR was prioritized as 24 among 280 NSRs deemed both a high-patient safety risk and required before the first Level 1 facility could transition to the new FEHR. Although the timelines and resource limitations remain challenging, encouraging changes are underway in our renegotiated EHRM contract, accountability and distribution of responsibilities between VA and Oracle-Cerner. During our current EHRM reset, we are focused on addressing all unmet needs of the first five GoLive sites, preparing for the Federal Health Care Center (North Chicago VA and its combined Department of Defense health care facility) to transition to the new FEHR, and restructuring our EHRM system. This restructuring places the GEC EHRM Council directly under the Assistant Under Secretary for Health for Patient Care Services; adds considerable supportive elements to the Councils, including Office of Health Informatics and Office of Information and Technology; and will accelerate resolution of the high-priority NSRs, including NSR 20211219, which will specifically address the needs of GRECCs, MIRECCs, PADRECCs and the innovation and research activities crucial to VA as a continuous learning health system.

3. GGAC appreciates the efforts from the Geriatric Scholars program in training and developing a geriatric workforce and recommends finding mechanisms to maintain the funding for the program which has by all accounts been quite successful and is under threat of significant constriction because of funding cuts from the Office of Rural Health.

GEC submitted a draft budget for maintenance and expansion of Geriatric Scholars, when prompted by calls from Congress for geriatric training for VA employees in the VA CAREERS Bill, currently pending in the Senate Committee on Veterans' Affairs. Additionally, GEC prepared an Unfunded Request to submit to Patient Care Services for additional funding, to address the budget shortfall predicted for FY 2024 and beyond.

GGAC recognizes the VA's priority for addressing health disparities in its Veteran population and recommends Geriatrics and Extended Care integrate consideration of health disparities in older Veterans and include diversity, equity and inclusion in GEC metrics across all the programs.
