Information Management Services Segment Implementation

Through pilot-projects and early deployment phases various common infrastructure services are being consolidated.

- Exchange server locations are reduced from 128 sites to 23 sites and will be further consolidated to 4 sites in the future;
- four Regional Data Processing Centers will replace hundreds of network and server hosting site across VA

Significant cost reduction will result from eliminating redundant infrastructure, consolidating IT hosting locations and centralizing requirements for technical skills

Shared Identity Services and Optimized Benefits Business Applications

After 06/2009 Common Identity services will be shared across all Benefits Business Lines

- Veterans will register only once to receive any VA benefit
- All benefits applications will share common veteran data
- All rebuilt benefits business Applications will share common components (such as claims processing and appeals processing)

Component sharing, data sharing, and process improvements will result in substantial cost avoidance in IT system maintenance and management

Common process for veteran registration and veteran self-service portal will revolutionize the veteran's convenience of interacting with VA

Shared Financial Services Segment Implementation

After 12/2007 Shared Financial Services will replace over twenty stove-piped financial applications

Significant cost reduction will result from eliminating redundancy and by providing and integrated Department-wide accountability

Shared Financial Services Segment and Asset Management Segment Integration

After the currently unscheduled integration of Financial Services and Asset Management Services, it will be possible to amortize capitalized assets on a VA-wide basis ...

Integration of Material Management and Financial functions across VA will prevent loss of assets and redundant asset acquisition - making additional funds available to apply directly to veteran services.

Identity Management Services Segment Architecture - Early Results

As of 12/2006, Early adoption of the VADIR on-line application, to verify discharge status on recently discharged veterans, has reduced the time required to complete this verification from 180-days to 2-days.

This improvement will contribute to reducing VA case backlog, reducing cost of delivering service and to in improving the seamless transition of recently discharged veterans into civilian life.
