  - To: Acting Principal Executive Director, Office of Acquisition, Logistics, and Construction (003)
    - 1. This memorandum requests delegation of authority (DOA) to the Executive Director, Office of Construction & Facilities Management (CFM) to execute Congressional notification letters for the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) major medical facility leasing program, pursuant to 38 United States Code (U.S.C.) § 8104(h). This delegation is designed to streamline and expedite the award of VA's prospectus-level leases and to eliminate redundant or administratively burdensome review and approval requirements.
    - 2. The Secretary delegated this authority to you on August 2, 2018 (Attachment 1). I request you further delegate this authority to the Executive Director of CFM, to execute congressional notifications for VA's Leasing Program. I request to further delegate this authority to the Associate Executive Director, Office of Real Property (ORP), as necessary to facilitate VA's Major Leasing Program and will notify your office of my decision to do so.
    - 3. The following laws grant VA authority to undertake the actions described in this memorandum:
      - 38 U.S.C. § 512(a) (Delegation of Authority)
      - 38 U.S.C. § 8103-8104 (Authority to Acquire Sites and Congressional Notice Requirements for VA Medical Facilities)
    - 4. In accordance with your delegation, CFM will obtain the necessary reviews and concurrences from the Office of General Counsel, the Office of Asset Enterprise Management, the Office of Congressional and Legislative Affairs (OCLA), and other applicable VA offices prior to the execution of the Congressional notification letters. OCLA will dispatch the letters to Congress. Existing laws and regulations will be adhered to and contracting authorities are not changed by this request.

- 5. Also in the delegation of authority approved by SECVA on August 2, 2018, SECVA waived the requirement of VA Directive 0000, paragraph 2(e), that all delegations of authority memoranda include a sunset date establishing a 2-year time limit. Accordingly, the attached Delegation of Authority (Attachment 2) does not contain a sunset date and will therefore be in effect until superseded or rescinded. If changes are needed in the future, my office will seek your guidance promptly.
- 6. Your signature below and on the attached Delegation of Authority will evidence your approval and delegate to CFM the authority to execute Congressional notification letters for VA's leasing program.
