## MEMORANDUM FOR UNDER SECRETARIES, ASSISTANT SECRETARIES AND OTHER KEY OFFICIALS

**SUBJECT:** Delegation of Authority to Act on Inspector General Reports of Investigations into Reprisal Allegations Made by Employees of Contractors and Grantees.

1. **DELEGATION.** This memorandum delegates to the Principal Executive Director, Office of Acquisition, Logistics and Construction (OALC), the authorities assigned to the head of the agency in 41 U.S.C. § 4712(c), including specifically, the authorities to receive applicable VA Inspector General Reports of Investigation; determine whether there is sufficient basis to conclude that the complainant was subjected to reprisal; issue an order denying or ordering relief; and to file an action for enforcement if necessary.

## 2. AUTHORITIES.

- a. <u>38 U.S.C. § 512 (a)</u>, Delegation of authority, assignment of functions and duties;
- b. <u>41 U.S.C.</u> § <u>4712(c)</u>, Enhancement of contractor protection from reprisal for disclosure of certain information;
- c. <u>41 U.S.C. § 3102(a)</u>, Delegation and assignment of powers, functions and responsibilities; and
- c. VA Directive 0000, Delegations of Authority.
- 3. RESTRICTIONS. None.
- 4. REDELEGATION. No further delegation is authorized.
- **5. EFFECTIVE DATE.** I waive the 2-year expiration date required by VA Directive 0000, Delegations of Authority, for this delegation. This delegation is effective upon signature and remains in effect for 4 years until otherwise rescinded, modified or superseded.
