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1 Introduction

1.1 Purpose

The *Kernel 8.0 Patch Supplement: XU*8.0*758 Reverse Negative Lock, Restricted Access User Guide* provides instructions on restricting access to VistA options in preparation for the transition away from Veterans Health Information Systems and Technology Architecture (VistA) software.

1.1.1 Background

Use of VistA menu options is monitored by the Office of Information and Technology (OIT) during Go-Live and post-Go-Live of the software transition.

Kernel patch, XU*8.0*758, is used by all VistA replacement programs including, but not limited to Electronic Health Record (EHR) systems, Defense Medical Logistics Standard Support (DMLSS), and Financial Management Business Transformation Service (FMBT) implementation of Integrated Financial and Acquisition Management System (iFAMS). Use of VistA options during and after the new EHR Go-Live, specifically, is restricted to those options that provide one of the following:

- VistA functionality that the EHR or other VistA replacement program does *not* support.
- VistA functionality requiring close-out of processes that were initiated before the VistA replacement program Go-Live.
- VistA functionality that maintains the VistA database integrity, which remains a vital component of the System of Record (SOR).

Veterans Health Administration (VHA) and OIT collaborated to create software requirements and technical processes for a new VistA patch, XU*8.0*758, which provides new functionality to restrict end-user access to VistA options defined by the criteria mentioned above. Patch XU*8.0*758 uses the REVERSE/NEGATIVE LOCK feature to restrict end-user access to VistA options by assigning the following security keys to appropriate VistA options:

- **DMLSS REPLACEMENT**
- **EHR REPLACEMENT**
- **IFAMS REPLACEMENT**

The process to restrict end-user access to VistA options requires a three-step process:

1. Agreement between VHA and OIT on specific VistA options for which end-user access should be restricted.
2. Assignment of the Program Replacement Security Key to end-users.
3. Assignment of the Program Replacement Security Key to the REVERSE/NEGATIVE LOCK (#3.01) field in the OPTION (#19) File for those VistA options requiring restricted access.

XU*8.0*758 introduces a new menu option, **VistA Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN]. As a secondary menu option, this menu is assigned to a few staff members, specifically the local facility EHR Modernization Cutover Lead or designee(s). All users must be aware of the impact when using the options on the **VistA Transition Menu**. It must be used only by staff who have received training and know its features, functionalities, and capabilities. Therefore, Patch XU*8.0*758 provides functionality to assign a security key to one or more users and one or more options. The security key can be removed when access is required, allowing user access to specific options.

This user guide demonstrates the features, functionalities, and capabilities of the Program Replacement Security Key using the **EHR Replacement** key as an example. Other VistA replacement program keys have the same features, functionalities, and capabilities; however, the sample user dialogs as presented in this user guide may differ in the local system.

1.1.2 Introduction to the Program Replacement Security Key Menu

The Program Replacement Security Key menu has nine options. Each option allows for varied functionality to control access and visibility to VistA menu options, which will be restricted after the new system Go-Live. These functions include adding, removing the replacement key from a single user, from a single division, and for all users, as well as adding, removing the program replacement security key from VistA menu options and namespaces. [Figure 1](#) shows the main menu of the Program Replacement Security Key.

2 Using the Software

The following sections provides step-by-step instructions on removing and assigning the Replacement Key.

2.1 Assign the Program Replacement Key to Users for One User

2.1.1 Overview

Use the **Assign Program Replacement Key to Users** [XUEHRM ADD KEY USERS] option to assign users the program replacement key. This is located under the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN] option.

2.1.2 Procedure

To assign the program replacement key, do the following:

1. From the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN], select the **Assign Program Replacement Key to Users** [XUEHRM ADD KEY USERS] option.
2. At the "What Program Replacement Key do you want to assign to Vista users?" prompt, enter **EHR REPLACEMENT** to locate the key.
3. At the "Do you want to select (U)sers, (D)ivisions, (A)ll users, (Q)uit: D//" prompt, enter **U** to assign the key to a single user only.
4. At the "Select a user:" prompt, enter the name of the user you wish to assign the key.
5. At the "Select another user:" prompt, continue to enter other users as needed.
6. At the "Are you ready to assign the program replacement <EHR REPLACEMENT> to the users? YES//" prompt, press **Enter**.

7. At the "Requested Start Time: NOW//" prompt, press **Enter**.
8. The system processes the request with a task number, as shown in ([Figure 2](#)), which can be validated in TaskMan (see Section [2.2](#)).

2.2 Validate the Task is Complete in TaskMan

2.2.1 Overview

Test if the system has assigned the program replacement key to the *user* by querying TaskMan.

2.2.2 Procedure

To test if the program replacement key was assigned, do the following:



NOTE: TaskMan is available only to staff with permissions. Thus, the following steps can only be completed if TaskMan is included in the menu tree. Also note, for larger facilities TaskMan may take longer to process the task.

1. Right-click and select **Copy** to copy the Task# from the previous procedure. (e.g., Task# 2771242, as shown in [Figure 3](#)).
2. From the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN], enter “**TOOLBOX**”. Then, enter “**TASK**” to access the **TaskMan User** [XUTM USER] option.
3. At the "Select TASK:" prompt, right-click and select **Paste** to paste the previously copied task number.
4. At the "Select Action (Task # *****):" prompt, enter **D** for **Display Status**.
5. The system shows the completed task with a timestamp ([Figure 3](#)).

2.3 Assign the Program Replacement Key to Users by Division(s)

2.3.1 Overview

Use the **Assign Program Replacement Key to Users** [XUEHRM ADD KEY USERS] option to assign the program replacement key users across a division. This is located under the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN] option.

2.3.2 Procedure

To assign the program replacement key to users across a **DIVISION**, do the following:

1. From the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN], select the **Assign Program Replacement Key to Users** [XUEHRM ADD KEY USERS] option.
2. At the "What Program Replacement Key do you want to assign to VistA users?" prompt, enter **EHR REPLACEMENT** to locate the key.
3. At the "Do you want to select (U)sers, (D)ivisions, (A)ll users, (Q)uit: D//" prompt, enter **D** to assign the key to a single division only.
4. At the "Select a division:" prompt, enter the name or code of the division you wish to assign the key.
5. At the "Select another division:" prompt, continue to enter other divisions, as needed.
6. At the "Are you ready to assign the program replacement <EHR REPLACEMENT> to VistA users at above Division(s)? YES//" prompt, press **Enter**.
7. At the "Requested Start Time: NOW//" prompt, press **Enter**.
8. The system processes the request with a task number, as shown in ([Figure 4](#)), which can be validated in TaskMan (see Section [2.2](#)).

2.4 Assign the Program Replacement Key for All Users

2.4.1 Overview

Use the **Assign Program Replacement Key to Users** [XUEHRM ADD KEY USERS] option to assign the program replacement key to *all* Vista users in the accounts database. This is located under the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN] option.

2.4.2 Procedure

To assign the program replacement key to **ALL USERS**, do the following:

1. From the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN], select the **Assign Program Replacement Key to Users** [XUEHRM ADD KEY USERS] option.
2. At the "What Program Replacement Key do you want to assign to Vista users?" prompt, enter **EHR REPLACEMENT** to locate the key.
3. At the "Do you want to select (U)sers, (D)ivisions, (A)ll users, (Q)uit: D//" prompt, enter **A** to assign the key to all users.
4. At the "Are you ready to assign the program replacement <EHR REPLACEMENT> to ALL Vista users? YES//" prompt, press **Enter**.
5. At the "Requested Start Time: NOW//" prompt, press **Enter**.
6. The system processes the request with a task number, as shown in ([Figure 5](#)), which can be validated in TaskMan (see Section [2.2](#)).

2.5 Remove the Program Replacement Key from One User

2.5.1 Overview

Use the **Remove Program Replacement Key from Users** [XUEHRM REM KEY USERS] option to remove the program replacement key from a user. This is located under the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN] option.

2.5.2 Procedure

To remove the program replacement key from a **USER**, do the following:

1. From the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN], select the **Remove Program Replacement Key to Users** [XUEHRM REM KEY USERS] option.
2. At the "What Program Replacement Key do you want to remove from Vista users?" prompt, enter **EHR REPLACEMENT** to locate the key.
3. At the "Do you want to select (U)sers, (D)ivisions, (A)ll users, (Q)uit: D/" prompt, enter **U** to assign the key to a single user only.
4. At the "Select a user:" prompt, enter the name of the user you wish to remove from the key.
5. At the "Select another user:" prompt, continue to enter other users as needed.
6. At the "Are you ready to remove the program replacement <EHR REPLACEMENT> from the users? YES/" prompt, press **Enter**.
7. At the "Requested Start Time: NOW/" prompt, press **Enter**.
8. The system processes the request with a task number, as shown in ([Figure 6](#)), which can be validated in TaskMan (see Section [2.2](#)).

2.6 Remove the Program Replacement Key from Users by Division

2.6.1 Overview

Use the **Remove Program Replacement Key from Users** [XUEHRM REM KEY USERS] function to remove the program replacement key from a user in a specific division. This selection is located under the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN] option.

2.6.2 Procedure

To remove the program replacement key from a user in a specific **DIVISION**, do the following:

1. From the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN], select the **Remove Program Replacement Key to Users** [XUEHRM REM KEY USERS] option.
2. At the "What Program Replacement Key do you want to remove from Vista users?" prompt, enter **EHR REPLACEMENT** to locate the key.
3. At the "Do you want to select (U)sers, (D)ivisions, (A)ll users, (Q)uit: D//" prompt, enter **D** to assign the key to a single division only.
4. At the "Select a division:" prompt, enter the name or code of the division to which you wish to assign the program replacement key.
5. At the "Select another division:" prompt, continue to enter other divisions as needed. Press **Enter** when you have completed adding other namespaces.
6. At the "Are you ready to remove the program replacement <EHR REPLACEMENT> from Vista users at above Division(s)? YES/" prompt, press **Enter**.
7. At the "Requested Start Time: NOW/" prompt, press **Enter**.
8. The system processes the request with a task number, as shown in ([Figure 7](#)), which can be validated in TaskMan (see Section [2.2](#)).

2.7 Remove Program Replacement Key for All Users

2.7.1 Overview

Use the **Remove Program Replacement Key to Users** [XUEHRM REM KEY USERS] option to remove the program replacement key from all Vista users in the accounts database. This is located under the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN] option.

2.7.2 Procedure

To remove the program replacement key from **ALL USERS**, do the following:

1. From the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN], select the **Remove Program Replacement Key to Users** [XUEHRM REM KEY USERS] option.
2. At the "What Program Replacement Key do you want to remove to Vista users?" prompt, enter **EHR REPLACEMENT** to locate the key.
3. At the "Do you want to select (U)sers, (D)ivisions, (A)ll users, (Q)uit: D/" prompt, enter **A** to remove the key to all users.
4. At the "Are you ready to remove the program replacement <EHR REPLACEMENT> to ALL Vista users? YES/" prompt, press **Enter**.
5. At the "Requested Start Time: NOW/" prompt, press **Enter**.
6. The system processes the request with a task number, as shown in ([Figure 8](#)) which can be validated in TaskMan (see Section [2.2](#)).

2.8 Add Program Replacement Key to Options for Namespaces

2.8.1 Overview

Use the **Add Program Replacement Key to Options** [XUEHRM ADD KEY OPTS] option to add the program replacement key to a VistA menu option for Namespaces. This is located under the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN] option.

2.8.2 Procedure

To add the program replacement key to VistA menu options for a **NAMESPACE**, do the following:

1. From the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN], select the **Add Program Replacement Key to Options** [XUEHRM ADD KEY OPTS] option.
2. At the "What Program Replacement Key do you want to assign to options?" prompt, enter **EHR REPLACEMENT** to locate the key.
3. At the "Do you want to select (N)amespaces, (O)ptions, (Q)uit: D//" prompt, enter **N** to add the key to a namespace.
4. At the "Please select a Namespace" prompt, enter the namespace to which you wish to add the replacement key.
5. At the "Select Another Namespace:" prompt, continue to enter other namespaces as needed. Press **Enter** when you have completed adding other namespaces.
6. At the "Do you want to remove any options from the list above? YES/" prompt, enter **NO**.
7. At the "Requested Start Time: NOW/" prompt, press **Enter**.
8. The system processes the request with a task number, as shown in ([Figure 9](#)), which can be validated in TaskMan (see Section [2.2](#)).

Use the **Add Program Replacement Key to Options** [XUEHRM ADD KEY OPTS] option to add the program replacement key to a Vista menu option. This selection is located under the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN] option.

2.9.2 Procedure

To add the program replacement key to a Vista **MENU** option, do the following:

1. From the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN], select the **Add Program Replacement Key to Options** [XUEHRM ADD KEY OPTS] option.
2. At the "What Program Replacement Key do you want to assign to options?" prompt, enter **EHR REPLACEMENT** to locate the key.
3. At the "Do you want to select (N)amespaces, (O)ptions, (Q)uit: D//" prompt, enter **O** to add the key to an option.
4. At the "Select an option prompt," enter the option name to which you wish to add the replacement key.
5. At the "Select an option:" prompt, continue to enter other option names as needed. Press **Enter** when you have completed adding other options.
6. At the "Do you want to remove any options from the list above? YES//" prompt, press **Enter**.
7. At the "Select an option" prompt, press **Enter**.

8. At the "Requested Start Time: NOW//" prompt, press **Enter**.

To remove the program replacement key to options for a namespace, do the following:

1. From the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN], select the **Add Program Replacement Key to Options** [XUEHRM REM KEY OPTS] option.
2. At the "What Program Replacement Key do you want to remove from options?" prompt, enter **EHR REPLACEMENT** to locate the key.
3. At the "Do you want to select (N)amespaces, (O)ptions, (Q)uit: D//" prompt, enter **N** to add the key to a namespace.
4. At the "Please select a Namespace" prompt, enter the namespace to which you wish to add the replacement key.

5. At the "Select Another Namespace:" prompt, continue to enter other namespaces as needed. Press **Enter** when you have completed adding other namespaces.
6. At the "Do you want to remove any options from the list above? YES/" prompt, enter **NO**.

Use the **Remove Program Replacement Key from Options** [XUEHRM REM KEY OPTS] option to remove the program replacement key to a Vista menu option. This is located under the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN] option.

2.11.2 Procedure

To remove the program replacement key from options for a Vista menu **OPTION**, do the following:

1. From the **Vista Transition Menu** [XUEHRM MAIN], select the **Remove Program Replacement Key to Options** [XUEHRM REM KEY OPTS] option.
2. At the "What Program Replacement Key do you want to remove from options?" prompt, enter **EHR REPLACEMENT** to locate the key.
3. At the "Do you want to select (N)amespaces, (O)ptions, (Q)uit: D//" prompt, enter **O** to remove the key for an option.
4. At the "Select an option prompt," enter the option name to which you wish to add the replacement key.
5. At the "Select an option:" prompt, continue to enter other option names as needed. Press **Enter** when you have completed adding other options.
6. At the "Do you want to remove any options from the list above? YES//" prompt, press **Enter**.
7. At the "Select an option" prompt, press **Enter**.
8. At the "Requested Start Time: NOW//" prompt, press **Enter**.
9. The system processes the request with a task number, as shown in ([Figure 12](#)), which can be validated in TaskMan (see Section [2.2](#)).
