VETERANS CANTEEN SERVICE PARTICIPATION IN THE VHA OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH AND FIRE PROTECTION PROGRAM

1. PURPOSE: This Veterans Health Administration (VHA) Directive establishes policy to ensure the Veterans Canteen Service (VCS or Canteen) participates in facilities' Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) and fire protection programs.

2. BACKGROUND

- a. Executive Order (E.O.) 12196, section 1-201d, specifies that Federal agencies must comply with the safety and health standards published by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA). Public Law 91-596, Section 19, the Occupational Safety and Health Act, contains special provisions to ensure safe and healthful working conditions for all Federal employees.
- b. After a previous review by OSHA of the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) OSH program, an evaluation report recommended that the relationships between VCS operations and VHA safety and health programs, inspections, and operations needed to be clarified. This Directive clarifies this relationship.
- **3. POLICY:** It is VHA policy that VCS located at VHA facilities must comply with the OSH and fire protection policies of the facility.

4. ACTION

- a. <u>Director, VCS, VHA Central Office.</u> Director, VCS, VHA Central Office, is responsible for:
- (1) Ensuring that labor-management relations responsibilities are fulfilled prior to implementing any changes involving conditions at any level of Canteen employment.
- (2) Developing and implementing written policies and procedures to ensure VCS operational compliance with VHA, VA, local, state, and Federal OSH and fire protection requirements. *NOTE:* Active participation of VCS management and employees in the VHA OSH and fire protections programs is encouraged.
- (3) Participating in developing guidance and training on OSH and fire protection issues appropriate for VCS employees.
- (4) Requiring, from each facility VCS, documentation of all OSH and fire protection training.

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- b. **Facility Director.** The facility Director is responsible for ensuring:
- (1) Labor-management relations responsibilities are fulfilled prior to implementing any changes involving conditions of employment at the facility.
- (2) Canteen Service Managers and employees are included in appropriate meetings, committees, and communications regarding OSH and fire protection issues.
- (3) Assistance is provided to Canteen Service Managers and VCS employees to enable them to participate fully in the OSH and fire protection programs.
- (4) Assistance is provided in identifying and developing alternative methods of training that minimize adverse impact on customer service or operations. *NOTE:* Alternative training methods and content must be evaluated and approved by the facility Safety Manager or Industrial Hygienist.
- (5) Canteen Service Managers have access to the VHA facility system used to document OSH training.
- (6) Resources for the correction of OSH or fire protection deficiencies are provided, within the limits agreed upon with the Canteen Service Manager or the Director, VCS, VHA Central Office.
 - c. Canteen Service Manager. Each Canteen Service Manager is responsible for:
- (1) Ensuring labor-management relations responsibilities are fulfilled prior to implementing any changes involving conditions of employment at the facility.
- (2) Ensuring full compliance with all local, state, and Federal requirements and VA and VHA policies, practices, and directives associated with VHA facility OSH and fire protection programs. *NOTE:* Canteen Service Managers may request assistance in compliance, or inspections related to compliance, when the need arises.
- (3) Developing and implementing written policies and procedures that are in compliance with and support the facility's policies related to OSH and fire protection programs, as well as applicable local, state, Federal, and VA requirements.
- (4) Developing and providing service-specific training addressing compliance with established OSH and fire protection policies and procedures in Canteen operations.
- (5) Soliciting expertise or assistance from facility resources in the development of local policies and training initiatives, as needed.
- (6) Documenting and tracking all OSH and fire protection training using the facility's system approved for documenting and tracking training.

- (7) Requiring that contractors performing maintenance, renovation, or construction in Canteen service areas comply with local Canteen and facility OSH and fire protection policies, relevant VA construction standards and guidelines, and applicable local, state, and Federal requirements.
- (8) Participating in inspections, evaluations, and job hazard analyses of Canteen work areas and operations intended to identify OSH and fire protection hazards.
- (9) Ensuring that immediate action is taken to eliminate OSH and fire hazards identified during Canteen inspections and evaluations. *NOTE:* VCS Managers are to request assistance and/or required resources from the facility Director or from the Director, Veterans Canteen Service, as appropriate.
- (10) Providing and requiring the use of appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) for all employees, as identified in the facility PPE hazard assessment.
- (11) Ensuring that all VCS employees fully and actively participate in the facility OSH and fire protection programs by requiring:
- (a) Employees attend all required OSH and fire protection training provided by the facility. **NOTE:** Alternative training methods that have been approved by the facility Safety Manager or Industrial Hygienist may be used to minimize adverse impact on customer service or operations.
- (b) Employees comply with established facility and Canteen OSH and fire protection policies and procedures and applicable local, state, and Federal requirements. Upon inprocessing, all new VCS employees must attend new employee orientation conducted by the facility, as well as VCS-specific training provided by the employee's supervisor.
- (c) Employees participate, as specified, in the facility's emergency response plan, and in fire and emergency drills. *NOTE:* Employee participation in hazard surveillance activities, including reporting of hazards in work areas to appropriate supervisors is encouraged.
- (d) Employees report all job-related injuries and illnesses to their supervisor immediately. **NOTE:** Employees and supervisors are to complete required accident-reporting and workers' compensation forms in accordance with VHA and VHA facility policy and requirements.
