Partnership Overview

The partnership between the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) Veterans Health Administration (VHA) and the Crohn's & Colitis Foundation (CCF) supports Veterans diagnosed with inflammatory bowel disease (IBD), including Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis. IBD causes chronic inflammation of the gastrointestinal tract and inflammation of the colon, resulting in painful ulcers and other symptoms. This partnership, facilitated by the National Center for Healthcare Advancement and Partnerships (HAP), enhances awareness and understanding of IBD to improve Veteran health and well-being.

Partnership Impact

Established in October 2021, the VHA-CCF partnership provided a range of educational content and support for Veterans.

- [Veteran-focused webpage](#), featuring step-by-step instructions for Veterans to access treatment and links to other VA resources, has over 3,500 unique page visits.
- [Crohn's & Colitis Foundation Veterans Support Group](#) offers a platform for Veterans with IBD to connect and share experiences to enhance community support. With approximately 79 members, the group facilitates open discussions, mutual support, and valuable insights.
