The Story of the Howling Dog




There is a story of an old man and his dog sitting on the porch. It's hot outside. The old man is sipping on his lemonade and the dog is sitting next to him howling in pain.

Perplexed, the neighbor asks, "why doesn't the dog just get up and move to another spot on the porch?"

The old man takes another sip of lemonade, smiles, thinks about his response and says, **"It doesn't hurt bad enough!"**



RECOGNIZING THE OBSTACLES

Our success is dependent upon addressing the <u>underlying</u> issues which contribute to Veteran Homelessness.

Mental Health & Substance Use Disorders

Studies suggest that nearly half experience significant mental illness, and 70% report substance abuse problems.

Service-Related Disabilities

The VA reports that a significant percentage of homeless Veterans have service-related disabilities. In 2020, roughly 56% of homeless Veterans reported having a disability.

Financial Instability

Data from the National Coalition for Homeless Veterans suggests that financial instability is a common precursor to Veteran homelessness.

Systemic Factors

Broader systemic issues, including economic disparities, lack of access to health care, and racial disparities, play a role in Veteran's housing and stability





"Meeting Them Where They Are"

This means providing support and assistance to veterans who are struggling with addictions and financial literacy deficits in a way that **acknowledges their current circumstances, challenges, and readiness for change**.



OUR APPROACH

Utilizing a Harm Reduction Approach to address the complex issues of financial literacy and homelessness among veterans is a wise and compassionate strategy.

By integrating the harm reduction (HR) approach into our financial literacy programs, we are not only addressing their immediate economic challenges, but also promoting their overall well-being and long-term stability.

- Focus on Theory Over Practice
- Judgement and Blame
- Assumption of Readiness for Change
- Lack of Flexibility
- Failure to Address Root Causes
- Punitive

The HR Approach

- Customizing Support
- Prioritizing Non-Judgement
- Focusing on Practical Skills
- Addressing Underlying Issues
- Promoting Gradual Progress
- Measuring Success Differently
- May be Engaged in Active Addictions



VS THE "REAL" BUDGET THE "IDEAL" BUDGET

Income: \$1000/month

Expenses:

Rent - **\$500** Utilities - \$200 Transportation - \$100 Food - \$100 (plus EBT) Savings +\$100

Expenses:

Food - **\$200** Rent - (-\$500) Utilities -(-\$200)

- Income: \$1000/month
- Drugs, Alcohol, cigarettes, etc. \$500 Transportation - \$100 Entertainment - \$200
