

Housing Education











2 Classes:

Obtaining Housing & Maintaining Housing

Internally created and launched in March 2023

Optional and offered to every Veteran

Offered gift cards for participants (using non-SSVF dollars)

Offered in-person and virtually

Require all new staff attend class also





Origin

- Created for those who need extra support for a housing search
- Builds a path and confidence for Veterans to do a search themselves
- A way for Veterans that aren't comfortable with technology to get more involved with their own search and get physical resources
- Opportunity to connect our Veterans with other services like Hire for Heroes (employment assistance)



Stats

In 2020, amount of time to move into a unit was over 120 days

In January 2023, only housing 50% of our Rapid Rehousing Veterans

Average of 13 referrals to Housing Specialists monthly

Now only taking an average of 72 days to move-in

Now housing 65%+

Challenges & Solutions

Veteran participation

Offer gift cards, offer to all newly enrolled Veterans,

require new staff to attend

Utilizing non-SSVF funds

Utilize donation dollars

Cannot offer in-person in all areas of the state

Offer virtual and in-person options to everyone

Veterans may not have transportation or technology

Offer rides, bus passes, in-person, connection to smart

phones

Accommodating different learning styles

Offer one-on-one classes



Equity Considerations

Will begin to track outcomes in the next quarter

Continuously improving based on feedback

Offer to all newly enrolled Veterans and those who have not found housing withing 3 months of enrollment
