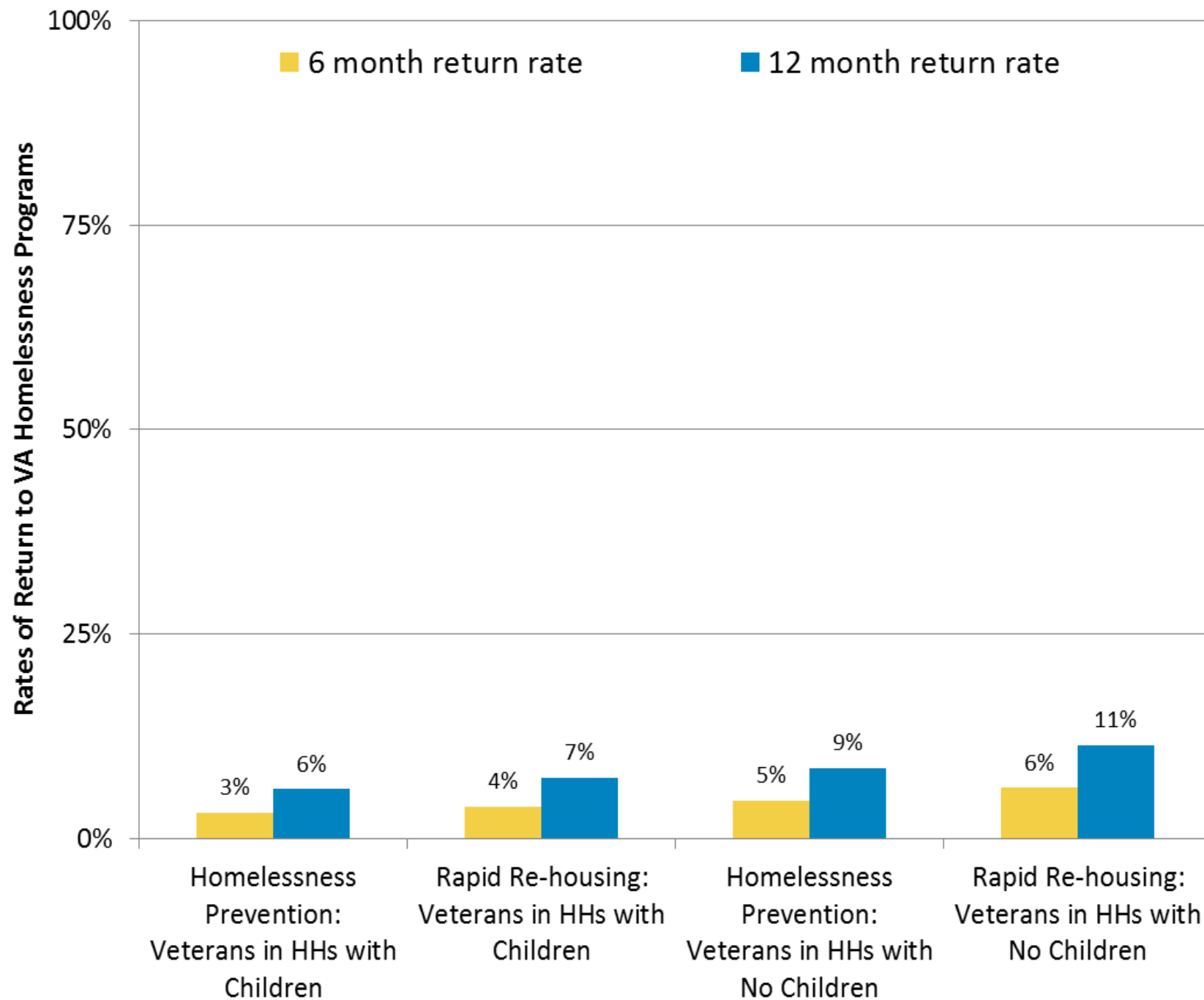

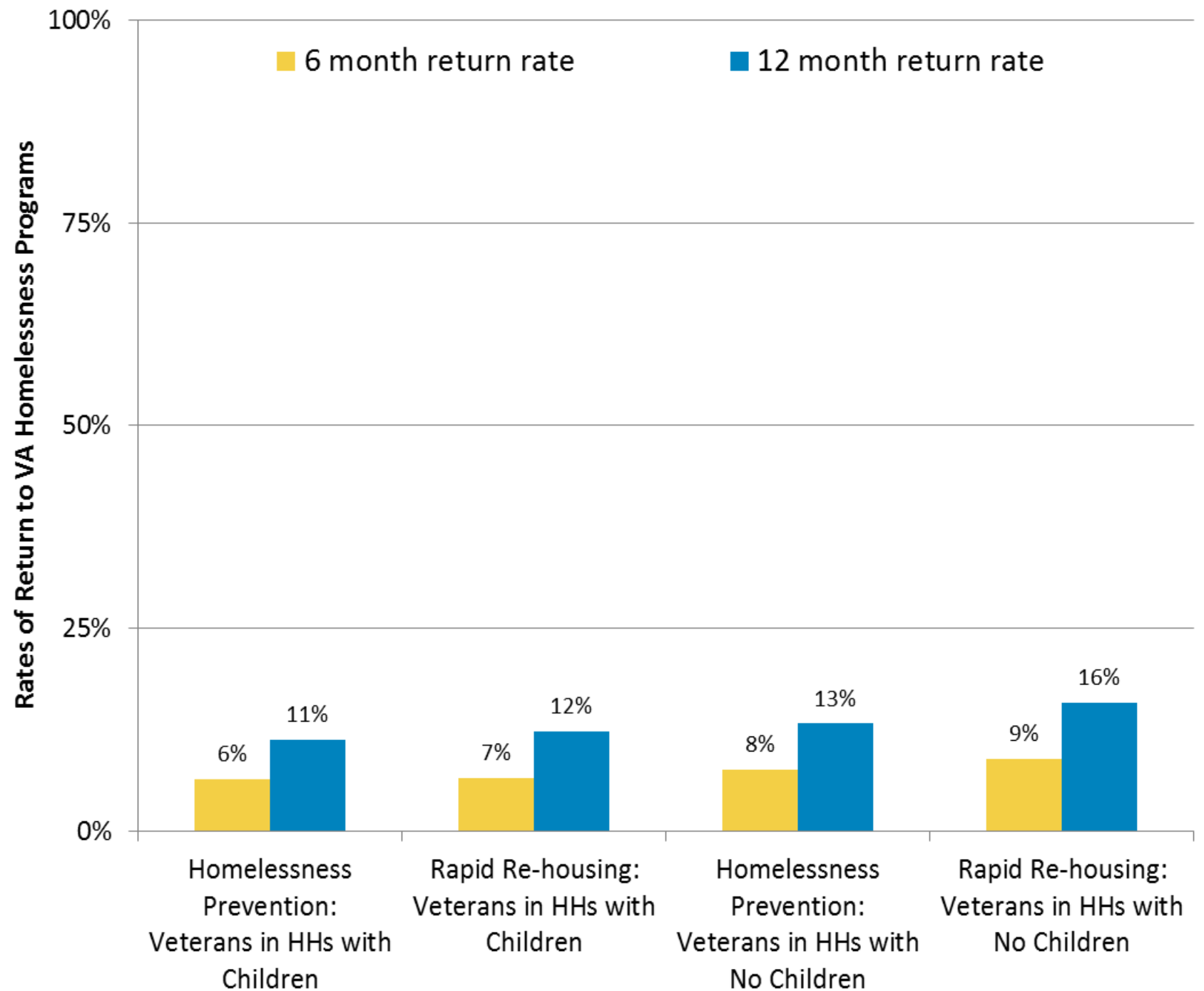
Does RRH Work and Why?



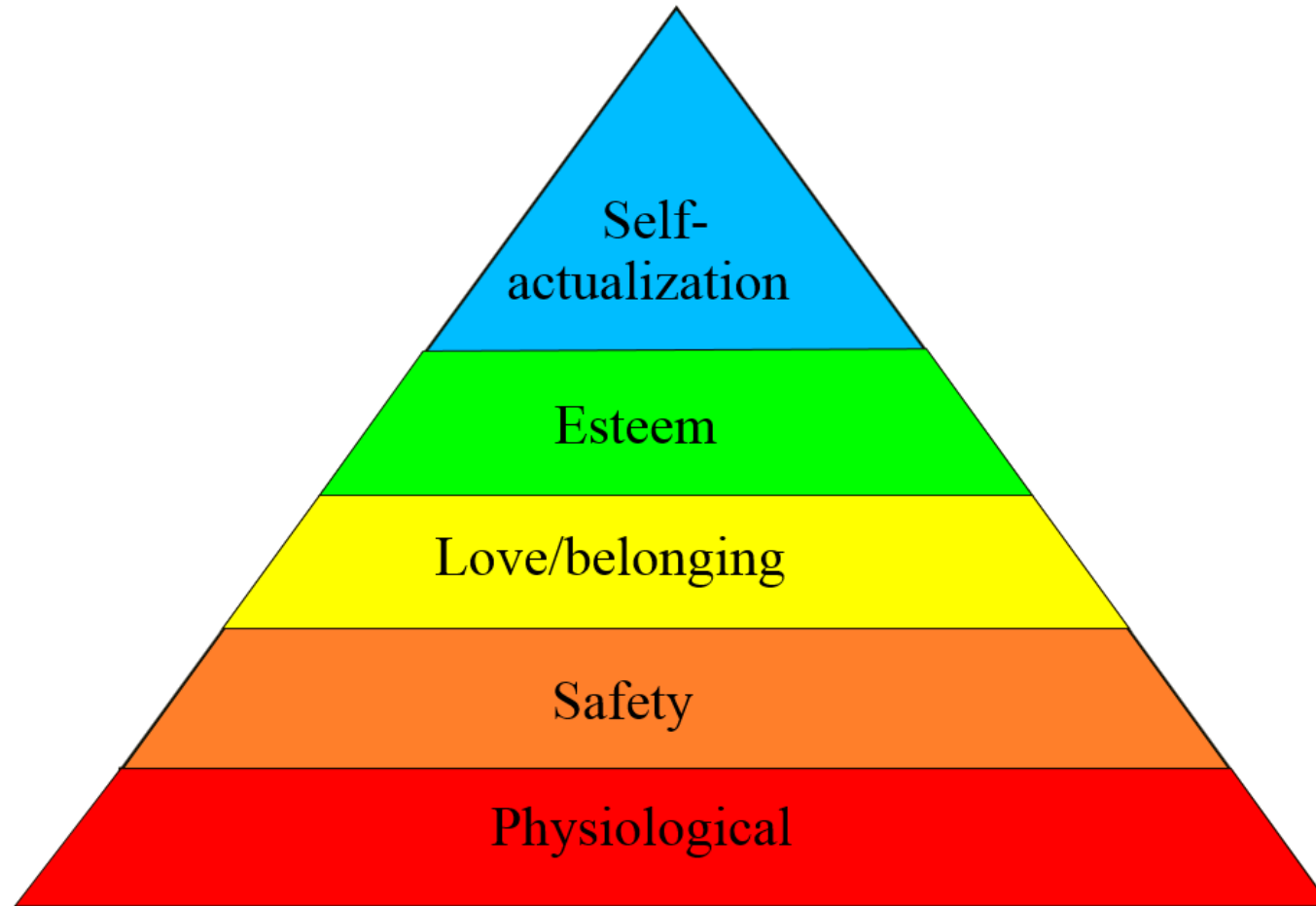
Return Rates October 2011 - September 2013



Return Rates October 2014 – May 2016

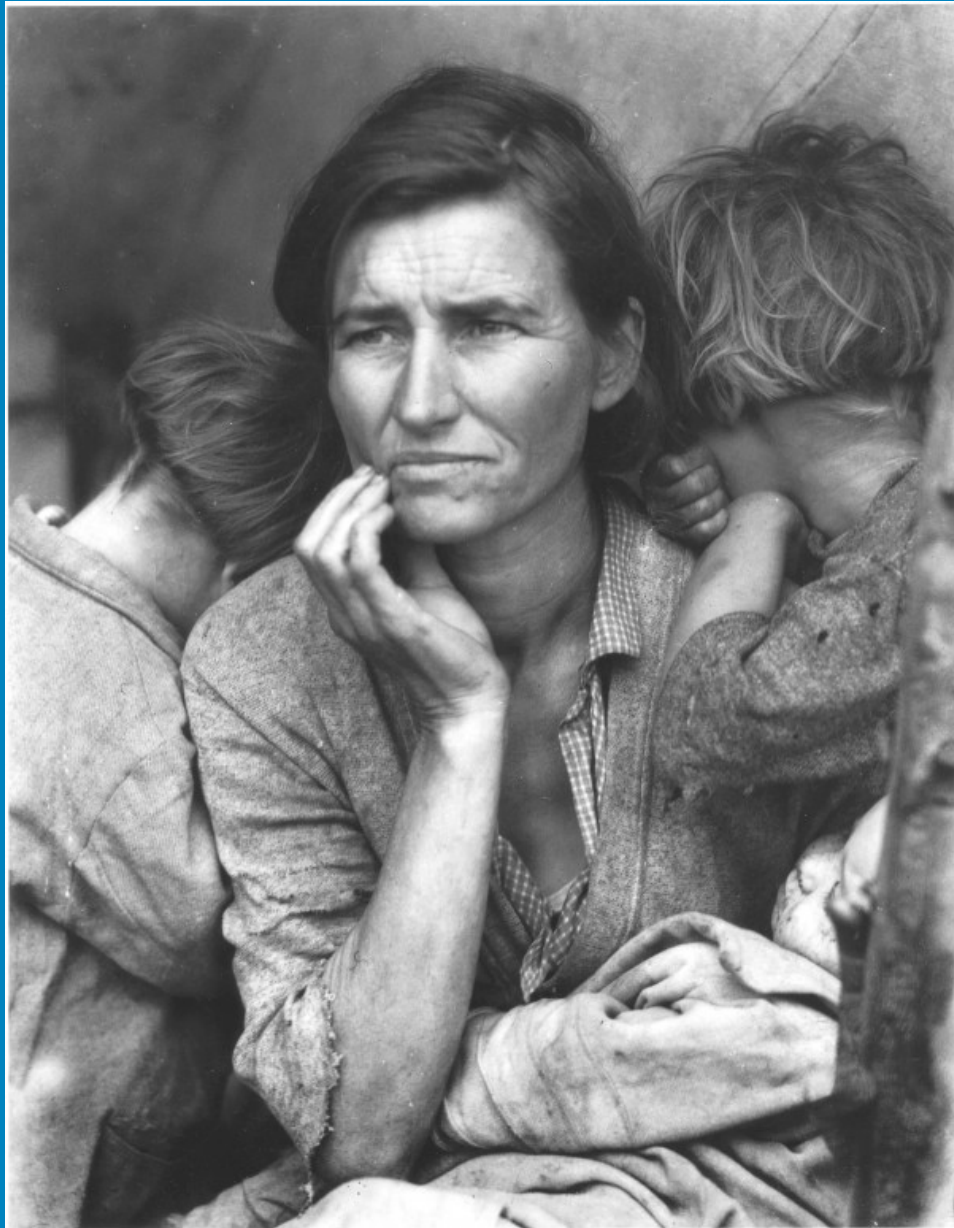


Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs

- 58% disabled

- Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF)

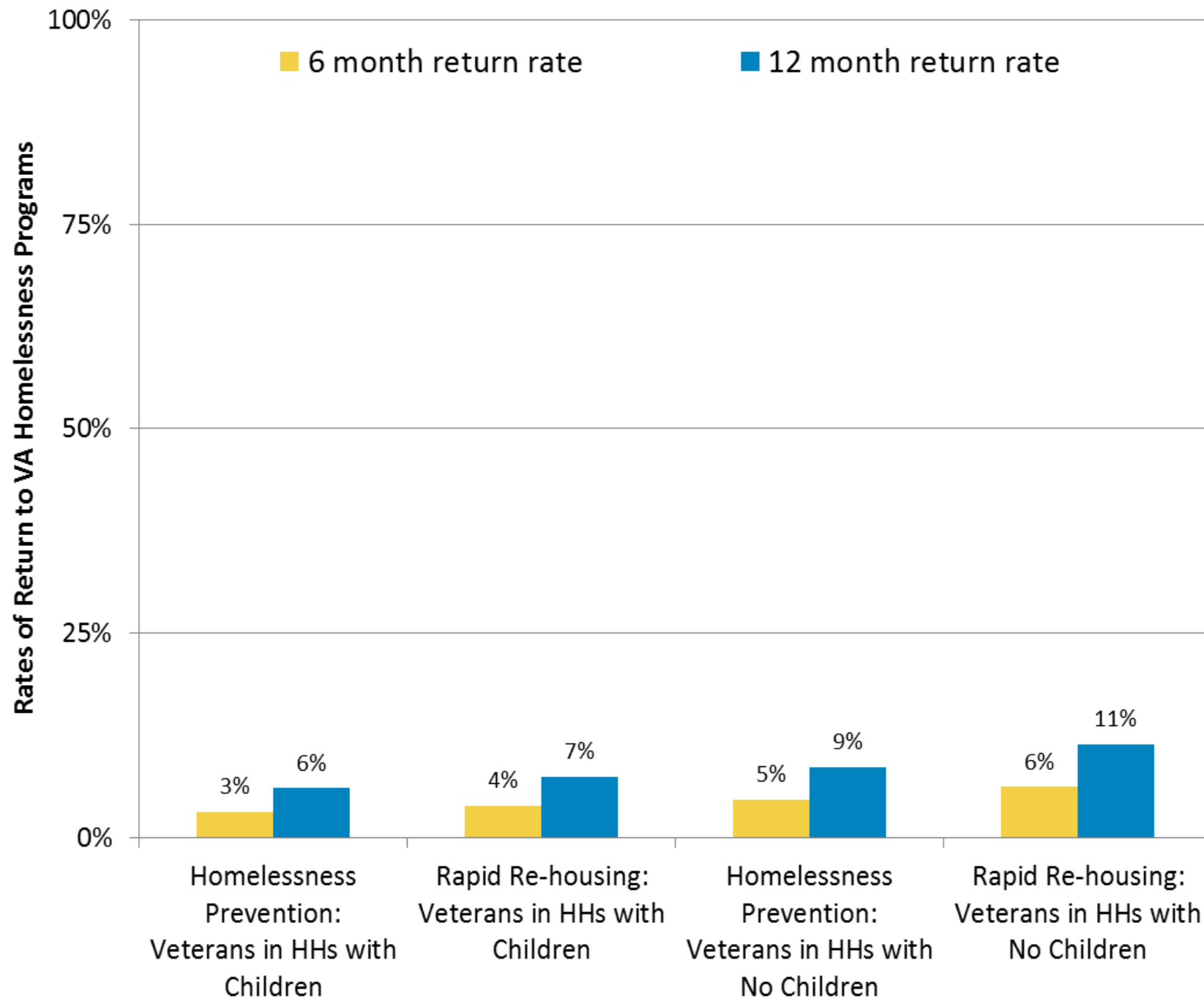

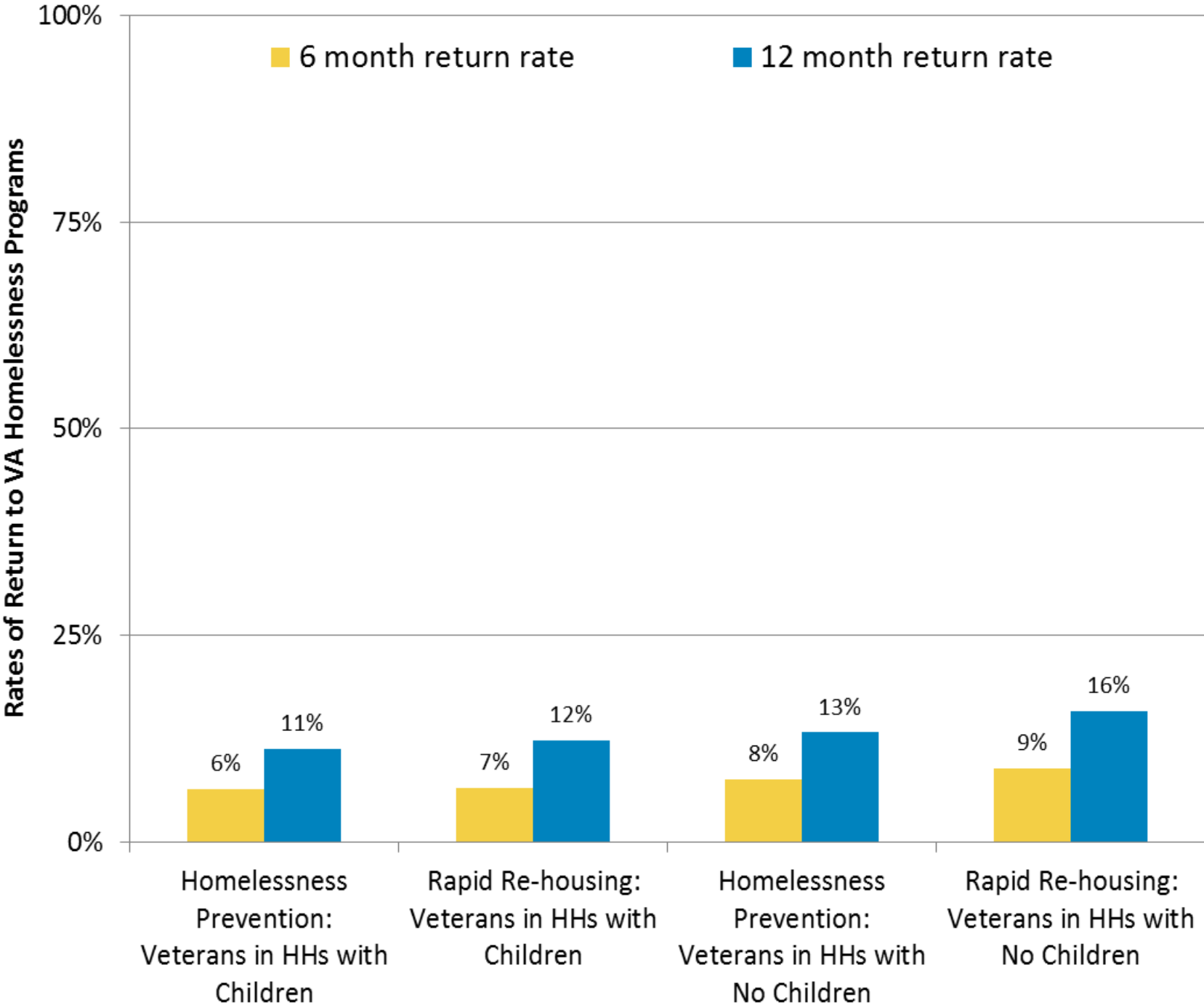
Significant reductions in homelessness among Veterans.

Return Rates October 2014 – May 2016



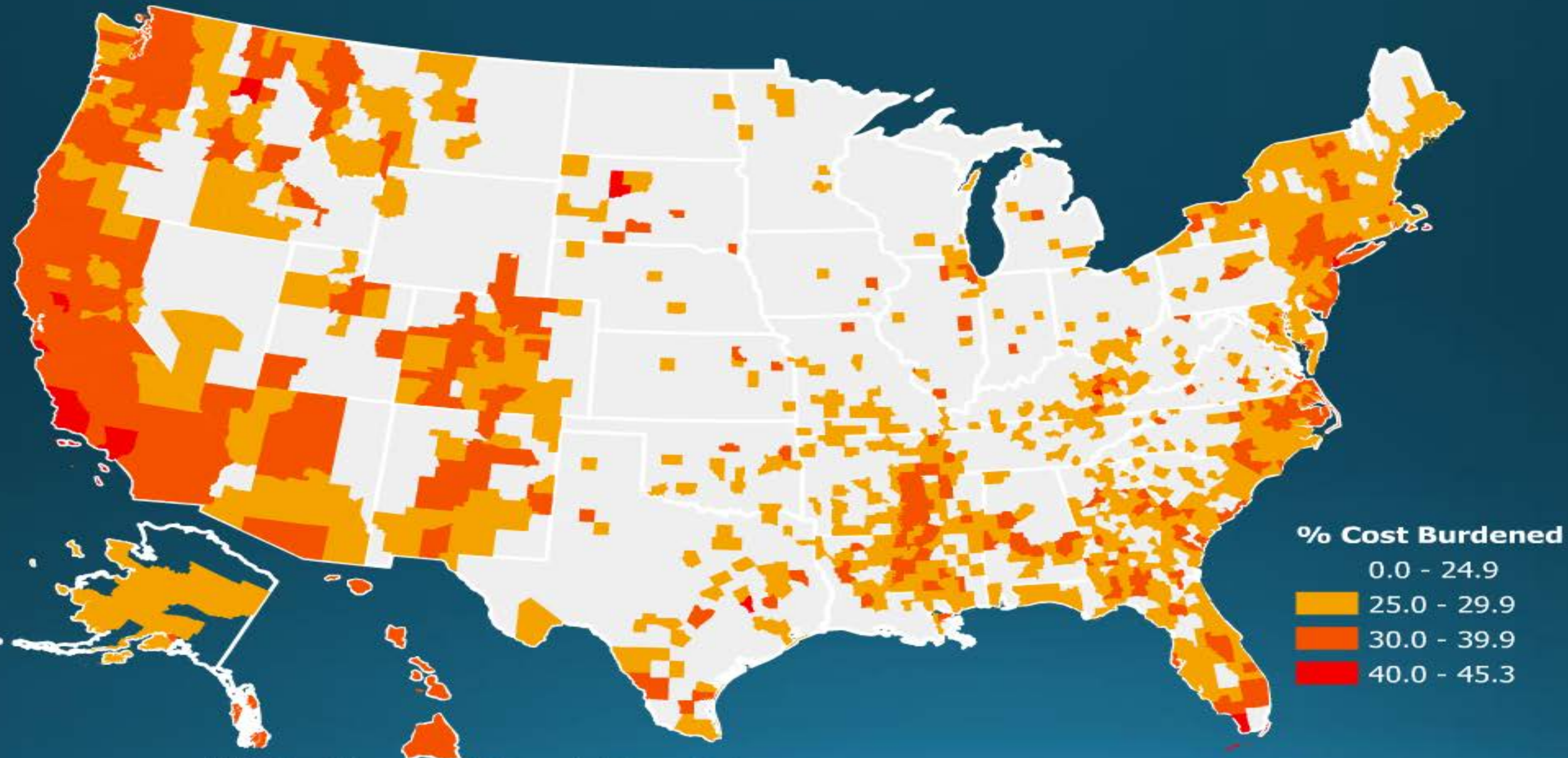
Housing Affordability, 1980



HAC Tabulations of 1980 Decennial Census Data

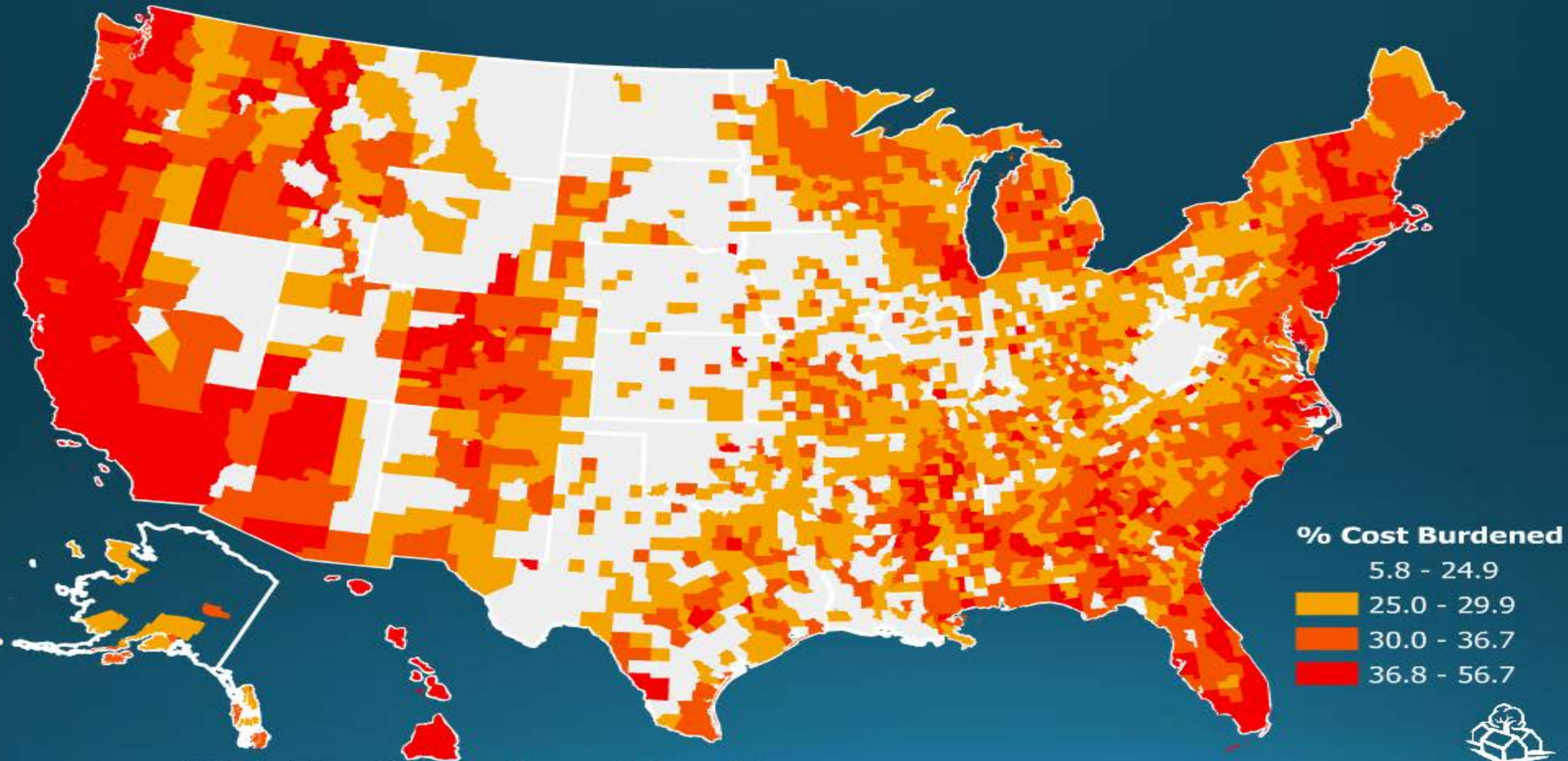


Housing Affordability, 2000

Housing Affordability, 2014



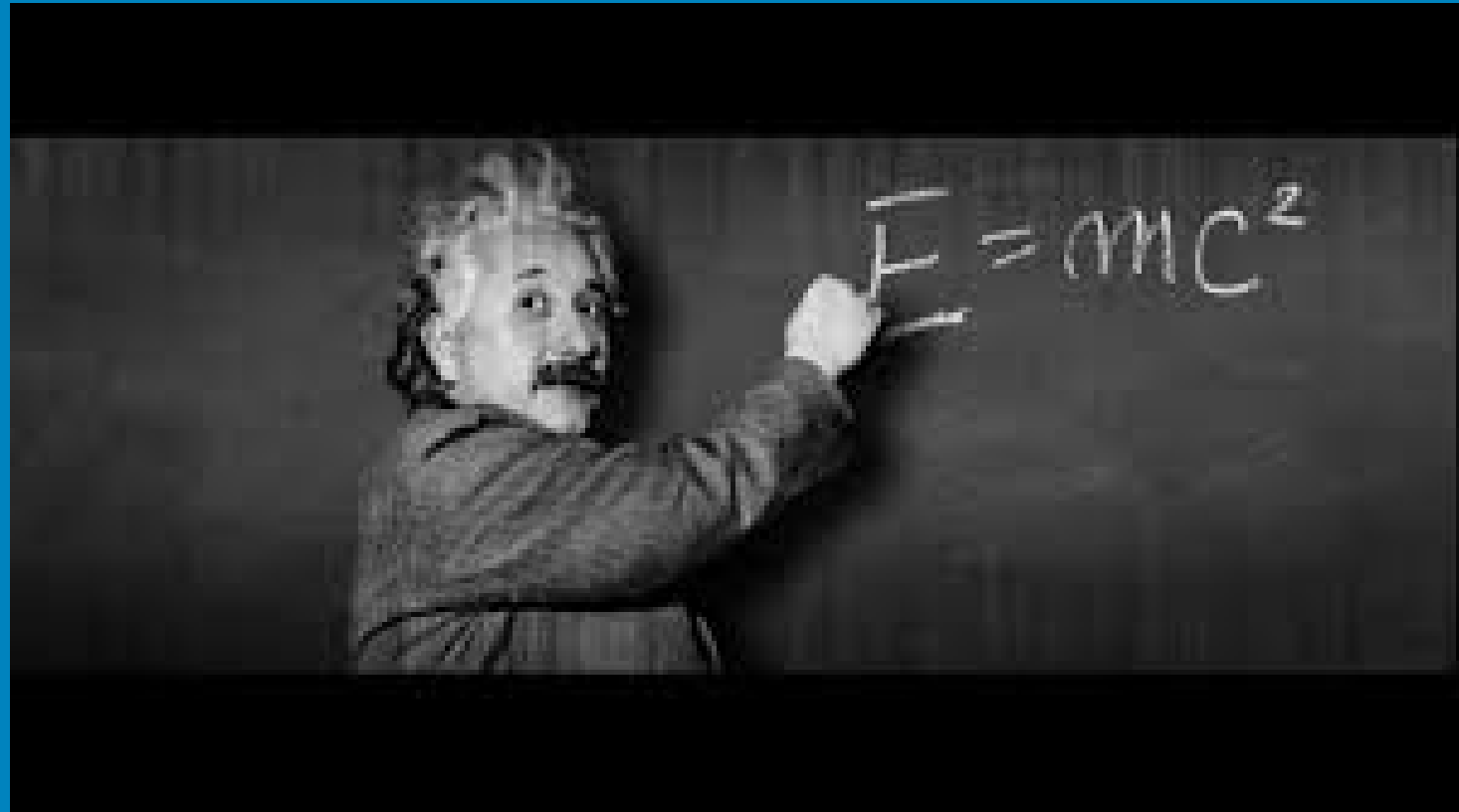
HAC Tabulations of American Community Survey Data

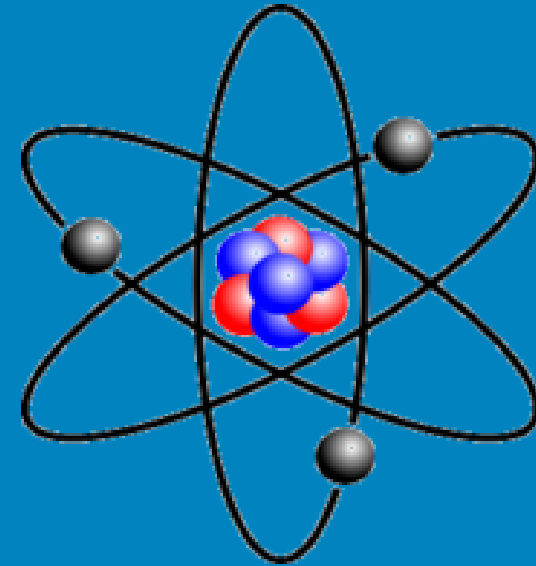
What now?

New Homeless Services Technology

- Coordinated Entry System (CES)
- Rational Resource Allocation



Manage Demand

- Reduce demand  diversion
- Prioritize resources
- Shared Housing
- Return Home pilot

Enhance Resources

- Funding outside of HUD & VA
 - Mainstream resources : TANF, CDBG, Medicaid
- Extend resources
 - AmeriCorps, VISTA, pro bono
 - Shared community resources

Collaboration - How to Start

- No special powers required – need to communicate
- Must set aside regular time, with periodic face-to-face meetings
- Good planning is inclusive
