U.S. Department of Transportation – Aviation Consumer Protection Division

The proper training and use of access equipment is a requirement of the federal Air Carrier Access Act. Anyone who suspects they've been discriminated against due to their disabilities, by an airline or airline employee, should speak to the airline's on-site Complaint Resolution Officer or file a complaint with the airline and the U.S. Department of Transportation's Aviation Consumer Protection Division (ACPD). Travelers may call the ACPD at 202-366-2220 (TTY 202-366-0511). Calls are returned Monday through Friday, from 7:30 am to 5:00 pm ET. Complaints may also be submitted via the web.

Parks and Trails, Accessible Camping, and Outdoor Adventures

Access Pass (formerly Golden Access Passport)

A free lifetime entrance permit to more than 2,000 recreation sites managed by five Federal Agencies, including federal parks, monuments and recreation areas charging entrance fees. The pass may also provide discounts on camping fees & some guided tours for the pass holder only. The Access Pass is issued to United States citizens or permanent residents of any age that have been medically determined to have a permanent disability that severely limits one or more major life activities.
