

Steps Toward Conflict Resolution

You can contact ORMDI toll-free at 1-888-566-3982 (TDD/TTY, dial 711 before providing this number) and speak with a specialist regarding equal employment opportunity (EEO) complaint processing or harassment prevention. You must initiate contact with an EEO counselor within 45 days of the date of the alleged act of discrimination by calling 1-888-566-3982 or visiting your local ORMDI Field Office. The harassment prevention procedures do not affect rights under the EEO complaint process. Harassment should be reported immediately to a manager or supervisor, Harassment Prevention Coordinator, or the **ORMDI Harassment Prevention Program.** For Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) services, email the Office of the Chief Human Capital Officer ADR team.



Commemorate
Women's History Month

This March, VA joins the Nation in commemorating Women's History Month, an annual observance highlighting women's contributions to events in history and society. This year's national theme is "Women Who Advocate for Equity, Diversity and Inclusion" and provides the opportunity to celebrate the accomplishments of women such as Dr. Gladys B. West.

Born in 1930 in Dinwiddie County, Virginia, Dr. West knew at a young age that she wanted more. Dr. West also knew that her ticket to freedom would be her education and went on to become a well-known mathematician. The film *Hidden Figures* depicts Dr. West's journey to advocate for equity, diversity, and inclusion.

"The next time someone uses their phone to get directions, think of Dr. Gladys B. West. She is one of the mathematicians whose work led to the development of global positioning system (GPS) technology, which allows our phones to take us where we want to go (and allows lots of other technologies to work). Because the earth is not a perfect sphere, mathematicians must model its actual shape for GPS navigation calculations to work. Dr. West was a pioneer in modeling the shape of the earth, paving the way for GPS technology. She had a 42-year career as a mathematician for the U.S. Navy. Like role model [Rear Admiral (Ret.)] Grace Hopper, she began her career working on some of the first computers. One of her jobs was to check the mathematics of these new machines, which [Dr. West found] was often incorrect! Her impressive career led to her being inducted into the U.S. Air Force Hall of Fame in 2018, a very distinguished honor" (Institute of Education Sciences).

A top priority for VA is to acquire and sustain a harassment-free work environment. This intentional pause and focused review will complement the existing mandatory workforce trainings VA deploys on the prevention of sexual harassment, the prevention of sexual assault, and on bystander intervention. Again, the goals are to guarantee that every employee comprehends that VA does not tolerate sexual harassment or sexual assault and to reinforce the policy that it is unacceptable to commit, excuse, or stay silent about sexual harassment or sexual assault.
