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## What is MVP?

### VA's Million Veteran Program

- Launched in 2011, MVP is a national VA research program and one of the world's largest programs on genetics and health
- Designed to advance precision health care by learning how genes, lifestyle, military experiences, and exposures affect health and illness







MVP has the largest cohort of people of African ancestry of any research program in the world







# Gene Variants Increase COVID-19 Kidney Risk in Patients with African Ancestry

990

Veterans with African ancestry who were hospitalized with COVID-19 were included in the study

- Findings suggest that a genetic risk assessment could help predict kidney risk from COVID-19 in patients with African ancestry.
- Veterans of African ancestry with specific gene variants were at heightened risk of acute kidney injury from COVID-19.

### Study Sheds New Light on Biology of PTSD

A 2019 study of more than

MVP participants identified several genes related to re-experiencing traumatic memories

- An MVP study found potential genetic links between PTSD and hypertension – meaning that existing hypertension drugs could potentially be useful in treating PTSD.
- A follow-up study identified a certain genetic marker linked to PTSD more commonly found in Black Veterans.

### Looking Ahead

- Reach 1,000,000+ Veteran enrollees
- Increase diversity of enrollees (gender, age, race, ethnicity, medical condition)
   through focused campaigns
- Broadly expand data access to researchers within and outside VA through the VA Data Commons
- Increase breadth and scope of scientific projects and scientific products in all relevant areas of health, including mental health and effect of military exposures
- Move scientific discoveries into the clinic to begin offering precision healthcare to Veterans
