

ndianapolis VA's HUD/VASH team (Housing and Urban Development/VA Supportive Housing) kept in touch with the veterans on their case load by phone. A couple weeks after COVID restrictions began, it became apparent that the usual food sources for many of our low-income veterans was not available. Food pantries were not open, buses were not always running, case managers were not allowed any face to face contact with veterans, friends and family that did have a car were reluctant to take them to the grocery store.

VA was able to partner with Gleaner's Food Bank. Case managers would identify veterans on the program mos in need of food that week. Gleaners would deliver a box of nonperishable food and often a bag of perishable items/person in the household. The case managers would deliver the food utilizing masks and ring and run or ding and ditch method. If needs were known a thermometer or appointment list was added into the box.

The location of how the boxes were delivered to case managers was a weekly, evolving process of change - just like many of the protocols for COVID. Eventually Gleaners was able to develop their own distribution system. Now Veterans can call directly for food assistance; transportation and shopping are more open. But at the time, it was a solution.
