

Vaccinations underway at CAVHS

Front-line staff, CLC, vulnerable populations first



Central Arkansas Veterans Healthcare System has received three shipments of the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine. We are still in the initial round of vaccinating our front-line workers and our long-term Community Living Center residents.

With the latest shipments, CAVHS has begun vaccinating vulnerable populations such as Veterans

75 and over, those on dialysis, undergoing chemotherapy, have had a transplant, and/or are homeless. A CAVHS staff member will contact each enrolled Veteran when it is time to schedule his or her vaccination.

CAVHS is following the CDC and Veterans Health Administration prioritization protocols for vaccine distribution. Homeless and at-risk Veterans at the CAVHS Day Treatment Center in downtown Little Rock are scheduled next for their initial vaccination.

Both the Moderna and Pfizer vaccines require two rounds. Once a staff member or Veteran receives the first dose, the second dose is scheduled for approximately 28 days later.

Vaccines will be available beginning January 8 at the Hot Springs, Conway and Pine Bluff CBOCs to Veterans 75 and over who have had an appointment in the last year. A staff member will contact you to schedule an appointment if you qualify.

More announcements will me made as more vaccine is made available.

VA 'Keep Me informed tool'

VA is working to get COVID-19 vaccines to Veterans as quickly and safely as possible based on CDC guidelines and vaccine availability. Due to limited supply, we can't afford to waste a single dose. But strict storage and handling requirements make distribution complex.

Veterans — avoid COVID-19 vaccine scams

Now that the COVID-19 vaccine is becoming available, scammers are calling, texting and emailing Veterans with promises of vaccine availability and early access to vaccines.

These promises are lies. The people sending these messages are identity thieves. They are after your sensitive personal information, such as your Social Security Number, and your money.

How can you know if the message you receive about a vaccine is a real VA message or a scam? Here are some tips on how to how to avoid scams and how to tell the difference.

Here's how VA will contact you

VA is beginning contact with Veterans to offer and administer COVID-19 vaccinations. You can sign up for vaccine updates by visiting https://www.va.gov/health-care/covid-19-vaccine/stay-informed. This is a valid and reliable source of information about VA's COVID-19 vaccine response.

Plus, individual VA medical facilities will soon start contacting Veterans about the vaccine. Outreach will most likely come through the VA.gov website, VEText, MyHealtheVet or VA emails. VA may also reach out to you via the US Postal Service through letters and postcards. Or you may get a phone call.

What VA will never do

No matter how we contact you, VA will *never* request money or your full Social Security Number through phone, email, or text message.

VA will *never* ask for your full Social Security Number or personal health information through a vaccination request call.

VA will *never* include hyperlinks in texts or emails that will take you to unofficial or non-secured web pages that ask you to provide personal information. Non-secured sites look like this: "http://." Secured sites look like this: "https://."

VA will *never* require payment in exchange for providing the vaccine early and will not require payment to become eligible for the vaccine.

VA 4th Mission saves life of non-Veteran

As COVID-19 cases continue to rise and stretch thin Arkansas' medical system, VA's Fourth Mission has brought Central Arkansas Veterans Healthcare System's resources and skills to bear in saving the life of a non-Veteran.

Angela Crouch, a resident of Stuttgart, Arkansas, was brought to John L. McClellan Memorial Veterans Hospital on December 13 in dire condition. Following emergency surgery and admittance to the Surgical Intensive Care Unit, the she has improved and is able to walk under nurse supervision.

"Y 'all saved her life," said her brother Roger from his home in Carlisle, Arkansas. "You were the only place that could take Angela, so you guys saved her life!

"The quality of communications has been off the charts," said Mr. Crouch, "I'm amazed at the amount of expertise, care and concern she's getting."

In times of national emergency, VA can provide care to non-Veterans under an assignment issued by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), based on a request for assistance from the state government. The State of Arkansas submitted a request to FEMA December 1 requesting acceptance of up to five non-ICU and up to five ICU patients who are not enrolled Veterans to VHA health care. Non-Veteran patients are admitted under the "humanitarian" category for COVID-19 or non-COVID-19 care.

CAVHS accepts such assignments when they do not negatively impact Veteran care. Non-Veterans should not directly seek care at CAVHS facilities.
