Our Program

The Montana VA Health Care System serves Veterans across the state of Montana and provides pharmaceutical care for over 31,000 Veterans. The Medical Center at Fort Harrison consists of a 34-bed acute care facility, a 24-bed residential treatment unit and outpatient services in primary and specialty care.

The Montana VA PGY1 Residency Program is designed to provide our resident with opportunities to expand their clinical knowledge and apply evidence-based treatments to improve the health and well-being of our Veterans. Each resident will participate in structured learning experiences focused on core pharmacy functions provided at the Montana VA and will have opportunities to work in collaboration with providers from a variety of services within the Health Care System. Residents will have the opportunity to obtain a teaching certificate in coordination with Skaggs School of Pharmacy at the University of Montana.

The PGY1 pharmacy residency is a one-year postgraduate program beginning on or near July 1st. While our program emphasizes training in ambulatory care settings; it does provide experiential opportunities in a variety of inpatient and administrative areas.

- Minimum 3.0 GPA or have completed a minimum of 3 years' experience in pharmacy practice
