VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS

Take the challenge and find out more about becoming a VA volunteer.

- ★ Must be 18 years of age or older for Adult Volunteers, and 14 to 17 years of age for Youth Volunteers
- * Complete a Volunteer Application, Volunteer Interview and Volunteer Orientation
- ★ Must be fingerprinted and receive a background check
- ★ Receive a health screening and TB test
- * Commit to 100 hours of service for Adult Volunteers, and 75 hours for Youth

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Volunteers are a very special part of our team in helping to support the needs of our nation's Veterans by "serving those who served." As a volunteer, you can experience meaningful and rewarding volunteer assignments throughout the VA Maryland Health Care System, including:

- **CAREGIVER SUPPORT VOLUNTEER** Provides visitation and support to Veterans in their homes.
- **COFFEE CART** Serves coffee to patients waiting for scheduled clinic appointments.
- **t** ESCORT SERVICE Assists with the internal transportation of patients to various clinics and treatment areas.
- **GREETER PROGRAM** *Welcomes patients and visitors* and provides directional assistance.
- **HOSPICE ASSISTANT** *Provides friendly support,* companionship and a listening ear for hospice patients.
- **PATIENT DRIVER** *Drives patients to and from their* scheduled clinic appointments.
- **PHARMACY AID** Assists pharmacy staff by assembling bottles, stocking shelves and running errands.
- **t RECEPTIONIST** *Greets patients and visitors, answers* phones and disseminates information.
- **† RECREATION ASSISTANT** Conducts a variety of diversional recreation and leisure activities.
- ***** SPECIALTY VISITATION Visits patients and distributes gifts during special occasions and holidays.
