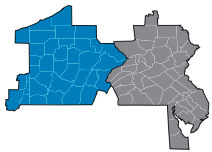
**188-bed**

Geriatric Center of Excellence Community Living Center. Offers transitional, rehabilitation, dementia and hospice care.

Veterans Recovery Center provides support to Veterans in recovery from substance use disorders and homelessness.

- **Ambulatory care center.** Offers primary, behavioral health, dental and rehabilitation care; adult day health care; and speech and pathology services.
- **MyHome suite.** Innovative, residential-simulation rehabilitation.



### VISN 4 Western Market

VAPHS, Butler, Erie and Altoona VA medical centers share resources to train staff and provide care to Veterans in their communities through face-to-face, clinical video telehealth and phone consultations. VAPHS provides the majority of physicians and providers.

### ACCESS

- **6,519 surgeries**, including 35 kidney and 23 liver transplants.
- **\$92 million Community Based Outpatient Clinic** to open in 2023 in Monroeville, Pennsylvania, to bring health care services closer to Veterans in southwestern Pennsylvania.

### COVID-19

- **50,523** total doses of COVID-19 vaccines provided to Veterans including:
  - » **42,122** doses provided at walk-in clinics
  - » **6,659** doses provided at mass vaccination clinics
  - » **514** doses provided to homebound Veterans
- **15** monoclonal antibody treatments provided to CLC Veterans

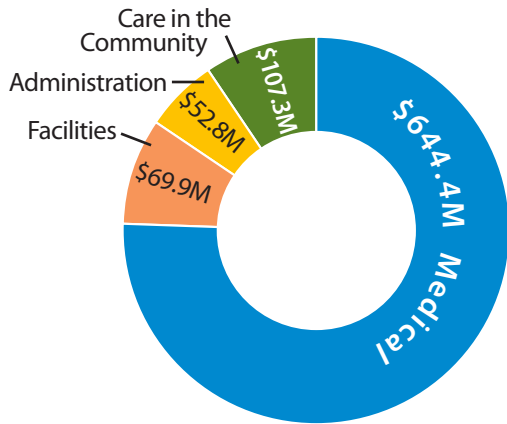

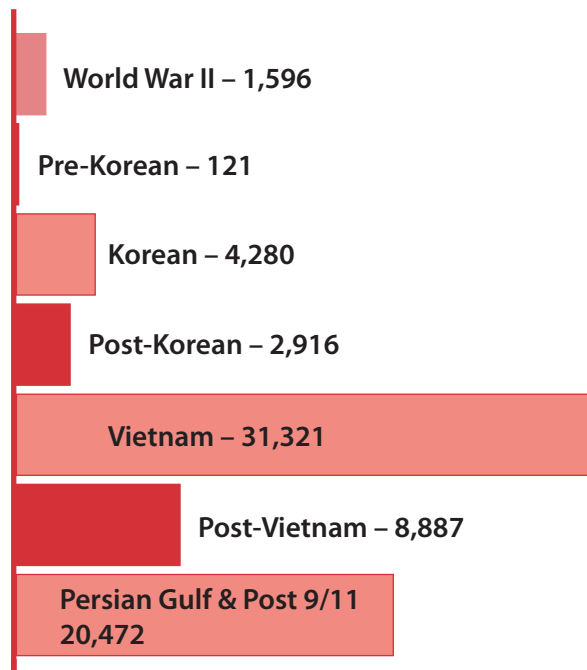
