Resource Fair & Town Hall for Rural Veterans

VA Eastern Colorado Health Care System will offer Veterans one-on-one support with VA benefits and services during upcoming resource fairs. Join us Feb. 13 in Burlington; Feb. 14, Lamar; Feb. 15, La Junta; Feb. 16, Alamosa; or Feb. 17, Buena Vista.

One-on-one support during resource fairs

Veterans, along with spouses and caregivers, will learn about VA health care eligibility. When confirmed eligible (DD214, income statements), Veterans will get assistance with enrolling and scheduling an initial appointment. Enrolled Veterans can get help with community care consults, beneficiary travel claims, caregiver support and home and community-based services for extended care needs.

Veterans and survivors can learn about newly expanded VA health care and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits and other toxic substances. If enrolled, Veterans can complete their initial toxic-exposure screening. If eligible, Veterans can enroll and receive a screening once every five years.

Community leaders can learn how local providers partner with VA and keep Veteran care timely and convenient and meeting their individual needs or circumstances, as well as explore community-based initiatives to end homelessness and prevent suicide.

VA ECHCS Director Michael Kilmer will finish each fair with a town hall, encouraging an exchange of information and feedback that will help VA health care meet Veteran needs in rural communities.
