The Department of Veterans Affairs Northern California Health Care System (VANCHCS) is an integrated health care delivery system, offering a comprehensive array of medical, surgical, rehabilitative, primary care, mental health and extended care to Veterans across Northern California.

VANCHCS is the 7th busiest VA health care system in the country.

During FY 2021, we completed 150 thousand more patient encounters than FY 2020 and 140 thousand more than FY 2019.

We have one of the most successful construction programs in the nation, totaling nearly \$400 million in current projects. Plans to expand services for our Veterans at sites across VANCHCS over next several years.

**KEY CONSTRUCTION
PROJECTS**

Since 1994, VANCHCS has enjoyed a VA/DoD sharing agreement with **David Grant Medical Center (DGMC)** on Travis Air Force Base.

- 133 VA staff assigned to DGMC work alongside their Armed Forces counterparts
- Average of 25 Veterans use DGMC daily
- 24-hour emergency room access
- Air Force satellite clinic at the VA Outpatient Clinic in Sacramento (McClellan)
- Twelve Joint Incentive Fund (JIF) programs, including:
 - Dialysis and Peritoneal Dialysis
 - Neurosurgery
 - Radiation Oncology
 - Inpatient Mental Health
 - Cardiovascular
 - Physical Therapy
 - Endovascular Surgery
 - Hematology Oncology Infusion
 - Orthopedic Surgery



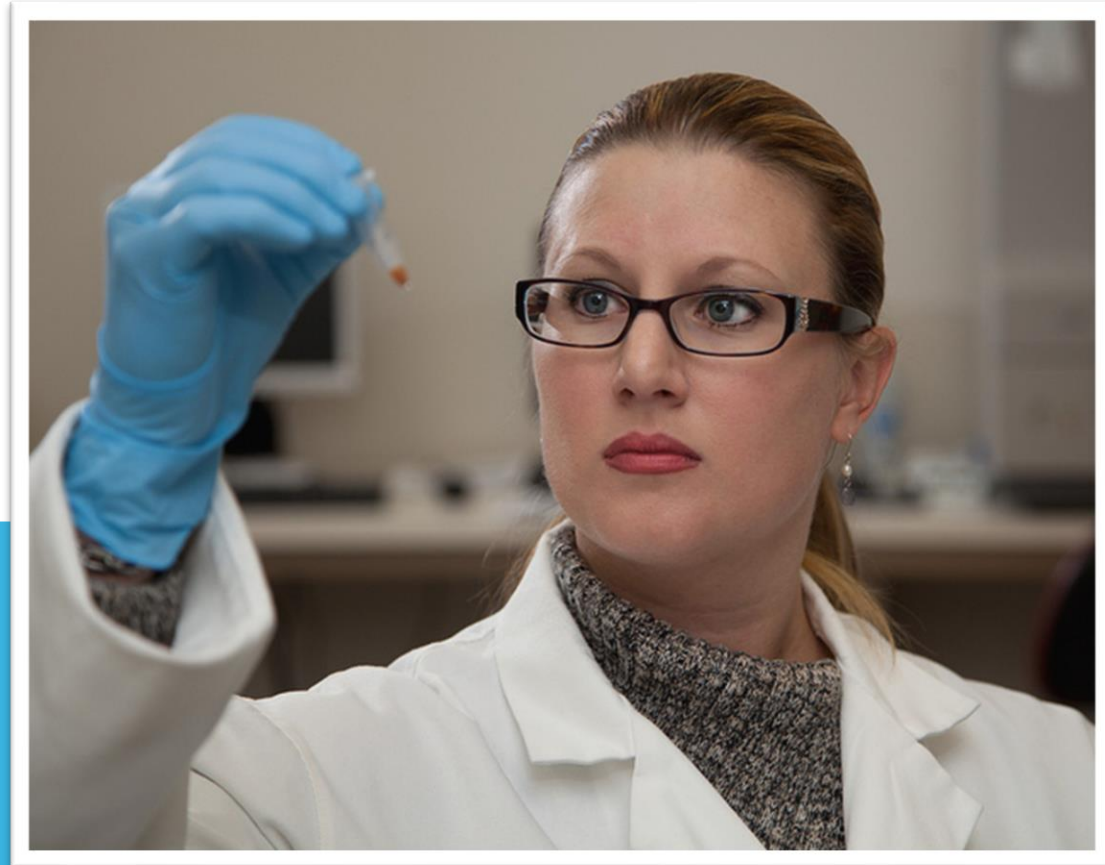

Projects range from laboratory research to patient-focused clinical trials of investigational new drugs and devices to studies of health care policy, finance, and delivery systems.

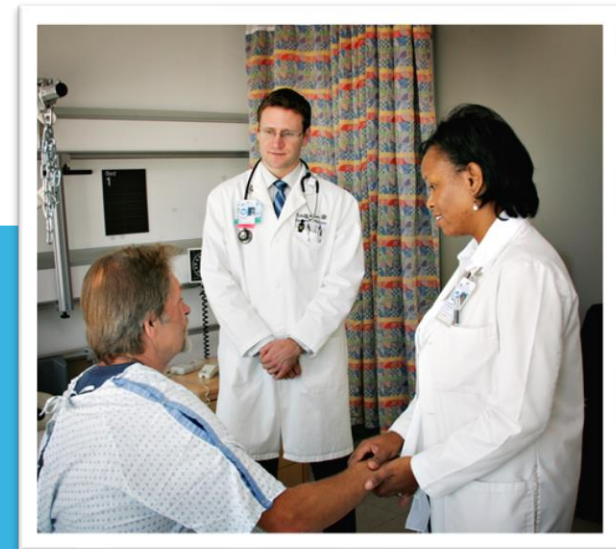


RESEARCH

We have maintained a partnership with the **University of California, Davis**, since 1975. Each year, about 400 university residents and 100 medical students are trained at the Sacramento VA Medical Center, Martinez VA Outpatient Clinic, and Center for Rehabilitation and Extended Care (CREC).

Academic affiliations are in place with about **175 additional institutions** for training in fields such as clinical psychology, nursing, social work, dental, allied health, pharmacy, preventive medicine, physical therapy, audiology, recreational therapy, and osteopathic medicine.

VANCHCS and the **University of San Francisco's School of Nursing and Health Professions** enjoy a VA Nursing Academic Partnership. It helps unify clinical and academic resources, increase baccalaureate student enrollment, and broaden clinical training capacity in the VA system.
