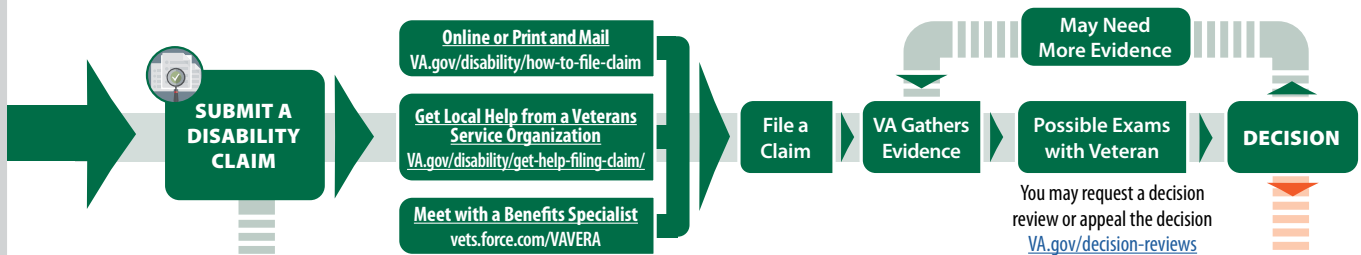

APPLY FOR VA COMPENSATION BENEFITS

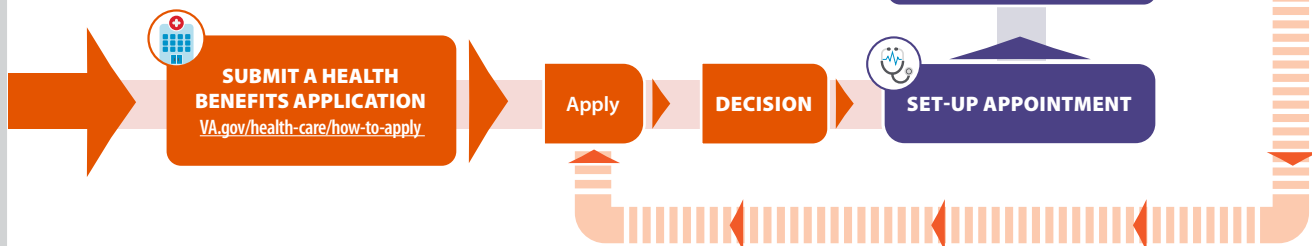
Veterans should reapply for PACT Act related claims if previously denied. 20+ more presumptive conditions for burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic exposures have been added.



SPECIALTY REFERRALS
Your provider may refer you for more assessments, exposure registry exams, or provide resources to file a disability claim.

ARE YOU ENROLLED IN VA HEALTH CARE?

VA health care and eligibility has expanded for Veterans with toxic exposures and Veterans of the Vietnam, Gulf War, and Post-9/11 eras.

TOXIC FRAGMENTS

Exposure registries are based on health exams for each cited environmental exposure. VA's health registry evaluation is a free, voluntary medical assessment for Veterans who may have been exposed to certain environmental hazards, and registry data helps VA understand (and respond to) environmental health problems more effectively. Adding your information to these registries does not create a compensation disability claim.

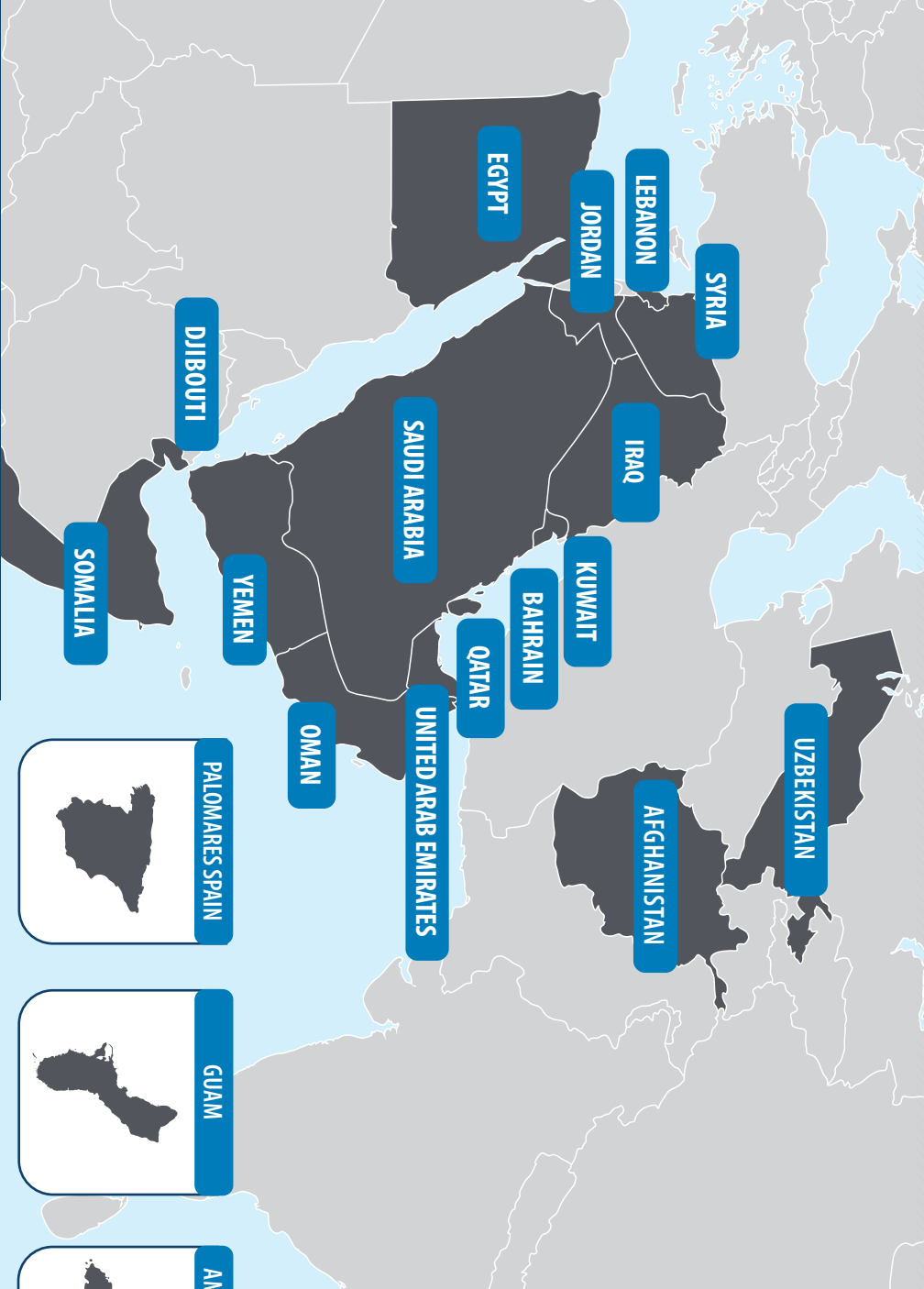


DID YOU SERVE HERE?



If you served on the ground, in the airspace above, in territorial waters, or a ship that called there, you may be eligible for VA benefits and health care for over 300 conditions.

YOU MIGHT HAVE BEEN EXPOSED TO:



AIR POLLUTANTS:
Burn pits, oil well fires, sulfur fire, sand, dust, and particulates



CHEMICALS:
Agent Orange or other herbicides, pesticides, and depleted uranium



RADIATION:
Nuclear weapons testing and ionizing radiation



WARFARE AGENTS:
Chemical warfare agents, nerve agents, and mustard gas



OCCUPATIONAL HAZARDS:
Asbestos, lead, fuels, and industrial solvents

Service members may have been subjected to any of these exposures in any of these areas.

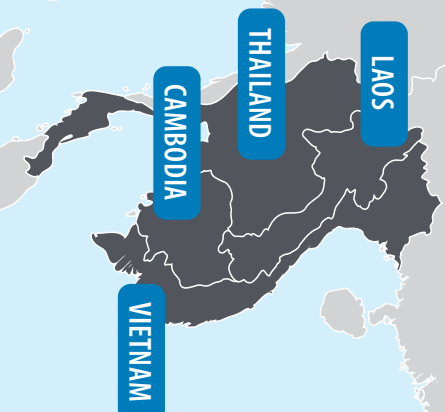
