Research Interests

Dr. Hughes' program of research is focused on improving earlier detection, monitoring, and treatment of cognitive and functional (IADL) declines in normal aging, mild cognitive impairment (MCI), and dementia through innovative in-home and mobile activity monitoring technologies. She has examined the underlying cognitive declines that contribute to early functional declines in older adults, and has demonstrated that subtle changes in IADLs that emerge in the transition from normal aging to MCI can be identified via passive in-home monitoring technologies before clinical diagnosis of MCI. Dr. Hughes' research has been independently funded by grants from the national Alzheimer's Association (New Investigator Grant), Oregon Partnership for Alzheimer's disease Research, OHSU NIA-Roybal Center pilot program, Veterans Affairs Research & Development (Merit Award Pilot), and NIH/NIA (ROI, SBIR Phase 1). Over the last decade, this work has yielded over 30 peer-reviewed publications in the areas of cognitive and functional decline in aging, MCI, and AD, ecologically valid cognitive assessment, early detection of cognitive decline in older adults at risk for dementia using in-home activity monitoring technologies, assistive IADL prompting technologies for older adults, and direct- to-home telehealth for dementia care. Dr. Hughes has an active research collaboration with John Ferguson, PhD, a biomedical engineer and UMN Associate Professor in Rehabilitation Medicine, on several research and development projects that incorporate novel technologies into assessment and rehabilitation of cognitive decline in older adults as well caregiver support.

He is an advocate for evidenced-based psychotherapies (e.g., CBT, ACT, DBT skills, exposure and response prevention), psychological assessment (MMPI-3), and measurement-based care (PROMIS). Dr. Marquardt works primarily with individuals experiencing anxiety, depression, compulsive behaviors, and posttraumatic stress.

Research Interests

Dr. Marquardt's primary research aim is to identify innovative targets for the treatment of internalizing disorders, particularly anxiety and depression. His research employs empirically validated measurement models of emotion, personality, and psychopathology, which he maps onto neurobiological variables. Through his research, Dr. Marquardt consistently finds that dimensional measures of emotion provide a better explanation for individual differences in cognition and neurobiological systems than traditional categorical psychiatric diagnoses. Dr. Marquardt brings expertise in psychometrics, multivariate statistics, and cognitive neuroscience. Currently, his active investigations focus on the MMPI and MPQ families of instruments, PTSD, and electroencephalographic (EEG) markers of attention and cognitive control. Furthermore, Dr. Marquardt applies longitudinal models of resilience from the developmental psychopathology literature to evaluate the effects of recent adverse life events among adults.
