Residency Program Directors



Theresa Frey, PharmD, BCPP (she/her/hers) is a Clinical Pharmacist Practitioner in mental health and substance use disorders (SUD) at the Madison VA. She graduated from the University of Wisconsin-Madison School of Pharmacy in 2009. 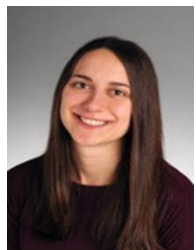
