Program Description

Our residency is a one-year, full time, ASHP accredited program that provides one resident per year a profound experience in delivering comprehensive pharmaceutical care to the veteran population with a focus on mental health services.

We prepare the pharmacist clinician to obtain a position as a clinical pharmacist practitioner, to begin a career in academia, or to continue residency training as a PGY2 resident in a focused area of practice.

- Teaching and presentations, including clinical seminars, case conferences, and journal club discussions are integrated into the program
- Resident-led topic discussions and clinical seminars provide public speaking opportunities
