Dear Veteran,

We want to introduce you to one of the VA's telehealth services, the Remote Patient Monitoring-Home Telehealth program, a FREE service for our veterans. The program is designed to assist you in managing your chronic health condition from the comfort of your home by providing education and looking at trends in health data.

How it works:

- VA assigns you a Home Telehealth remote monitoring care coordinator who is a Registered Nurse (for medical), Social Worker (for mental health), or Registered Dietician (for Tele-Move).
- Your care coordinator will assess the equipment needed to send health data with you.
- Your care coordinator will look at your health data during the workweek, assist you with education, and create goals towards improved health.
- The typical time on this program is 4-6 months, up to one year.

Our goals:

- Help you regain control of your health.
- Assist you in identifying signs and symptoms.
- Connect you to the right resources at the right time.

You are provided with equipment to send health data, like vital signs, to your care team. Your care coordinator works with YOU and your healthcare providers to help manage your care in the comfort of your home.

One of the home telehealth nurses may contact you to discuss the program, with a consult from your Primary Care Provider, to see if you are interested in enrolling in this voluntary program to assist with your health.
