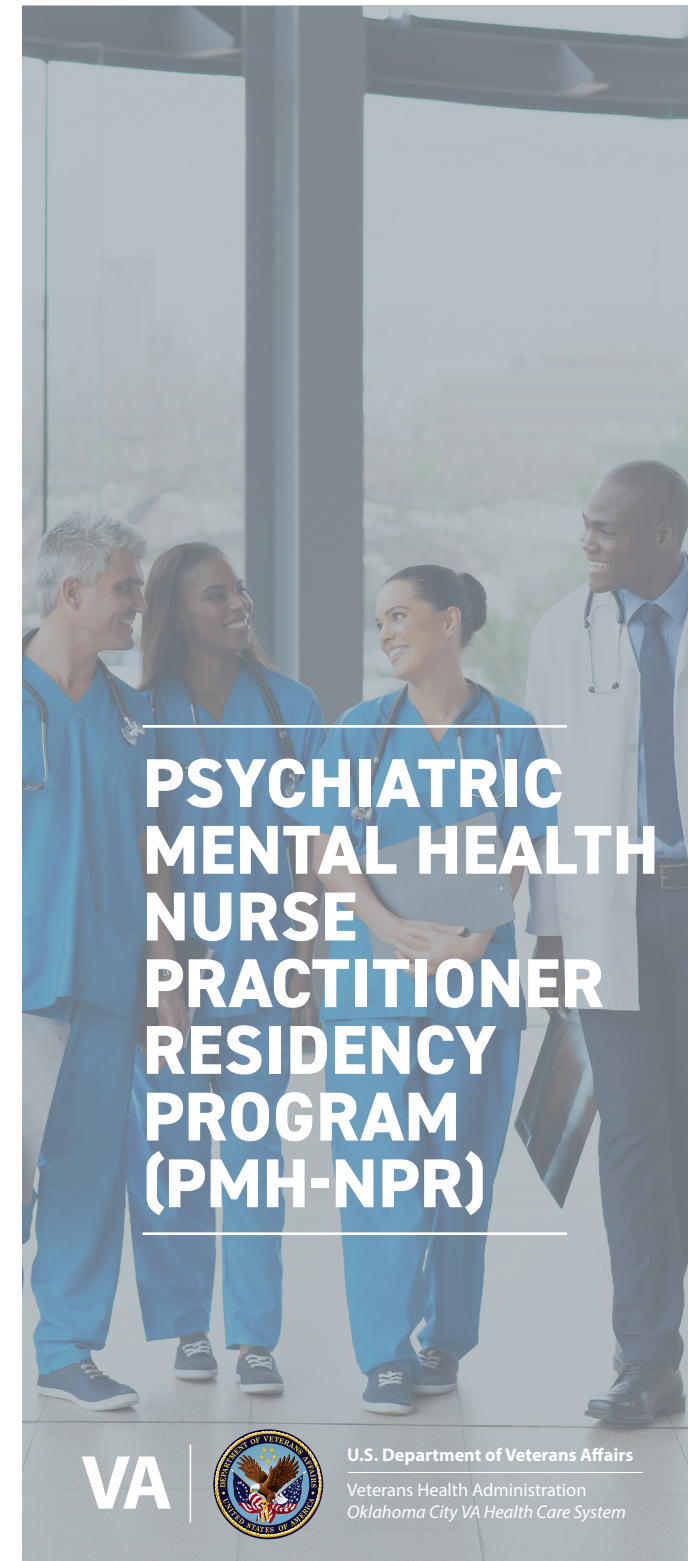

NURSE PRACTITIONER RESIDENT

The Nurse Practitioner Resident will focus on assessment, diagnostics and treatment of complex clinical cases using evidence-based practice. Residents will be matched with clinical and academic experts in a protected learning environment with opportunities for leadership development. Clinical rotations will be within the OKCVAHCS and Community Based Out-Patient Clinics (CBOCs)

Nurse Practitioner Resident Eligibility:

- US Citizen by birth or naturalization
- Fluent in written and spoken English.
- Be a recent graduate (within 12 months) of an accredited master's, post-master's certificate, or doctoral level NP program.
- Have recently graduated with less than one year experience as a nurse practitioner.
- Complete MH-NPR board certification prior to the start of the residency
- Possess a current, full active and unrestrictive registration as a graduate professional nurse and NP in a state, commonwealth, or territory of the United States, or the District of Columbia, prior to the start of the program.
