

List of Possible Placements

Please note that this list of placements is not exhaustive and subject to change without notice.

Mental Health Social Work

- Behavior Health Interdisciplinary Program – BHIP: Outpatient, long-term individual therapy and groups.
- Family Program: Marriage and family therapy.
- Primary Care Mental Health Integration – PCMHI: Outpatient, short term individual therapy accessed via primary care.
- Intensive Community Mental Health Recover Services – ICHMR: Community based, multidisciplinary care for veterans with severe mental illness.
- Valor Point Domiciliary: Residential treatment located in Lakewood with the goal of providing veterans with assistance and treatment to gain skills to live and thrive independently.
- Psychiatric Emergency Services – PES: Veterans who present to the Emergency Department and need to be evaluated for safety including suicidal and homicidal ideation.

Homeless Social Work

- Housing of Urban Development and VA Supportive Housing – HUD-VASH: Rental assistance, case management and clinical services for veterans experiencing homelessness.
- Community Resource and Referral Center – CRRC: Located on Santa Fe in Denver that provides a myriad of resources for homeless veterans including showers, job assistance, screening for housing and more.
- Healthcare for Homeless Veterans – HCHV: Outreach and case management for veterans experiencing homelessness providing an entry point to access VA services.
- Veterans Justice Outreach – VJO: Identifying justice-involved veterans and facilitating VA services at the earliest point possible.

Medical Social Work

- Inpatient Medicine: Veterans admitted to the Rocky Mountain Regional VA Hospital in Aurora, Colorado.
- Patient Aligned Care Team – PACT: Primary care social work at the VA hospital and outlying clinics.
- Spinal Cord Injury – SCI: Veterans who are inpatient or outpatient and have a spinal cord injury and psychosocial needs.
- Traumatic Brain Injury – TBI: Veterans who are outpatient and have a TBI and psychosocial needs.
- Hematology/Oncology: Veterans who have a blood disorder and/or cancer diagnosis and psychosocial needs.
- Intimate Partner Violence Assistance Program – IPVAP: Veterans who use and experience interpersonal violence with providing resources, safety planning and groups.

- Military 2 VA – M2VA: Providing support to veterans who are discharging from the military by providing case management and additional support as they access VA services and integrate into VA healthcare.

Geriatric Social Work**

- Geri PACT: Geriatrics primary care for veterans who are 65 and older and have complex psychosocial needs
- Contract Nursing Home – CNH: Community based nursing home care for veterans who need short-term rehab, long term care, respite or hospice
- Home Based Primary Care – HBPC: Community based primary care for homebound veterans who need medical care and have psychosocial needs
- **Please note that many programs listed above can have a geriatric focus and therefore would be eligible for a GRECC stipend.
