This office has received official information that Miss Marcia Lee Gates has been interned by Japan at Camp Santo Tomas, Manila.

You may communicate with her by following the instructions on the inclosed circular for sending ordinary mail.

No packages can be sent at this time to persons interned in the Orient. When arrangements have been made to send packages to Japan and Japanese occupied territory, a permit in the form of a label will be issued without application to the next of kin of each person officially reported as being interned by the enemy.

If her name appears on further information received by this office, you will be advised.
