- For 2009, 19 exams for Gulf War I veterans completed to date



















#### Gulf War I Registry Exams Exposures

- Smoke from oil fires
- Diesel fumes
- Exposure to burning trash/feces
- Drank or consumed food contaminated with smoke, oil or other chemicals

- Unknown chemicals
- Bathed in contaminated water
- Drank contaminated water

- Panic disorder
- Diverticulitis

- Complete Compensation and Pension claim if not already done
