

Responsibilities

- Provide burial space for veterans and maintain cemeteries as National Shrines
- Administer the Federal grants program for construction of state veterans cemeteries
- Furnish headstones and markers
- Administer the Presidential Memorial Certificate Program

National Cemetery Administration

- 125 Cemeteries
- 2.9 million gravesites
- 100,185 total burials FY 2007
- 1,589 FTE
- Five Memorial Service Networks
 - 1 Philadelphia, PA
 - 2 Atlanta, GA
 - 3 Denver, CO
 - 4 Indianapolis, IN
 - 5 Oakland, CA



American Customer Satisfaction Index 2007 Survey Results

- Highest score in customer satisfaction ever awarded to a federal agency or private organization ... rating of <u>95</u> out of 100 possible
- 98% of respondents believed that NCA served their loved ones in a respectful way
- Repeated NCA's overall score of 95 that was also earned in the last survey (conducted in 2004)

Eligibility

- Any member of the Armed Forces of the United States who dies on active duty.
- Any veteran who was discharged under conditions other than dishonorable.
- National Guard members and Reservists with 20 years of qualifying service, who are entitled to retired pay or would be entitled, if at least 60 years of age.
- Spouses and minor children.


- Grave Site

- Presidential Memorial Certificate





National Cemetery Administration FY 2007 – Memorial Programs






State Cemetery Grants Program

- VA provides 100% of development costs
- \$316 million awarded in 162 grants since 1980
- 35 states plus Guam and Saipan received grants



- 69 operational, 5 under construction
- 23,200 interments in FY 2007
