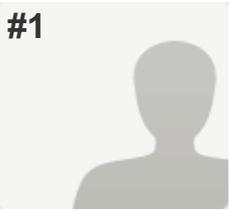

This follow up includes following a veteran driven plan to help the veteran be stable in the community. The release of information to the landlords also gives the case manager an opportunity for communication with educating the landlords of services. Veterans placed into RRH with HUD/VASH are assigned a case worker for follow up. Dayton VAMC is proposing that a case worker be assigned to each client opened with SSVF Prevention services to assist with intensive aftercare case management.

 In addition to ensuring that each Veteran is provided with resources of community partners that are available for assistance, Veterans know that they are welcome to contact their SSVF provider for prevention screening. With the GPD change of scope, there is a 90 day, 6 month and 1 year follow up with each Veteran that is discharged. There is ongoing case management with HUDVASH. SSVF providers have built relationships with community partners to stay up to date on available area services for eligible and ineligible Veterans.
