TRANSPORTATION AND MOTOR VEHICLES

- 1. PURPOSE. This directive provides Departmentwide policy required to implement or supplement provisions of the Federal Property
 Management Regulations (FPMR) when freight transportation services are furnished for and are payable by VA and/or when payment of transportation charges for property is for or on behalf of VA.
- 2. **POLICY.** Federal agencies are required to issue new or revise existing regulations and procedures relative to transportation documentation and audits that conform to the provisions of FPMR 101-41. These provisions will be adhered to and enforced.
- 3. RESPONSIBILITY. The Deputy Assistant Secretary for Acquisition and Materiel Management (90) will ensure that a program is established in the Office of Acquisition and Materiel Management to review, develop, and issue Departmentwide guidance and provide support relative to freight transportation services within VA.
