1. The purpose of this memorandum is to provide information and materials necessary to complete the 2023 PACT PCMHI Program Assessment.

2. Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers and Community Based Outpatient Clinics (CBOC) that serve 5000 or more unique Veterans are required to have integrated mental health services that operate in their primary care clinics (Veterans Health Administration [VHA] Handbook 1160.01). VHA is also committed to ensuring mental health access at CBOCs that serve fewer than 5000 unique Veterans. Annual program assessments support facility, VISN, and national efforts to enhance implementation and service availability.

3. Please see the attached materials for an important required annual assessment regarding PACT PCMHI Services.

a. "2023 PACT PCMHI Program Assessment PDF Guide" is a guide for sites when completing the online assessment and it includes the link for the web-based program assessment. The PDF is included solely for reference.

b. "2023 PACT PCMHI Program Assessment Facility List" identifies facilities in each VISN for which assessments are to be completed. This includes facilities of all sizes with primary care clinics. On the first page of the PDF guide are guidelines for identifying the individual at each facility who should complete the assessment.

4. This assessment must be completed within 30 days of receipt of this memorandum.

Background

The VHA Handbook (1160.01, 9/11/2008, Uniform Mental Health Services in VA Medical Centers and Clinics) describes requirements for integrated mental health services that operate in primary care clinics at VA medical centers and community-based outpatient clinics (CBOCs) serving at least 5,000 patients annually. These services include two required components: **1) Co-located Collaborative Care (CCC):** one or more mental health professionals who are integral components of the primary care team and who can provide assessment and psychosocial treatment and **2) Collaborative Care Management (CoCM):** based on the Behavioral Health Laboratory (BHL), Translating Initiatives for Depression into Effective Solutions (TIDES), or other VA-approved evidence-based strategies. PCMHI CoCM was formerly known as PCMHI Care Management (CM). This name change was made to be consistent with the literature, emphasize the collaborative nature of the role, and further differentiate from PACT-related medical care management.

Mid-sized CBOCs, that serve between 1,500 and 5,000 Veterans annually, must have mental health services on-site, which may include PCMHI and/or general or specialty mental health services. CBOCs serving fewer than 1,500 unique Veterans must provide access to mental health services, which may include on-site services, telemental health or referrals to VA facilities, Vet Centers or non-VA care.

Names for integrated mental and behavioral health care services in Patient Aligned Care Teams (PACT) Primary Care (PC) may vary. In this Program Assessment, “PACT PCMHI” or simply “PCMHI” refers to any provision of integrated mental and behavioral health care services in Patient Aligned Care Team Primary Care settings.

Section 3: PCMHI Co-located Collaborative Care

PCMHI Co-located Collaborative Care (CCC) involves PACT primary care and mental health providers working together in the PC setting with shared responsibility for Veterans' mental health concerns. Co-located collaborative care includes consultation with other PACT staff providing care to the Veteran through "curbside" discussions (i.e., impromptu communications between PC and PCMHI providers regarding clinical issues) and in team meetings, focused assessment, joint treatment planning, expertise in psychopharmacology, brief therapy and complex behavioral health interventions. These services are provided by licensed independent mental health providers, generally but not exclusively in-person.

Section 4: PCMHI Collaborative Care Management

PCMHI Collaborative Care Management (CoCM; formerly known as PCMHI Care Management [CM]) is a package of protocol-based services that support Primary Care-based prescribing of psychotropic medications, longitudinal follow-up and behavioral health interventions. The package includes patient education, activation, monitoring of medication adherence and structured, measurement-based assessment of progress over time (e.g., Behavioral Health Laboratory [BHL], Translating Initiatives for Depression into Effective Solutions [TIDES], other VA-approved care management). Care management services generally are provided over the telephone, and in close collaboration with PACT PC team members and with supervision by licensed independent MH providers.
