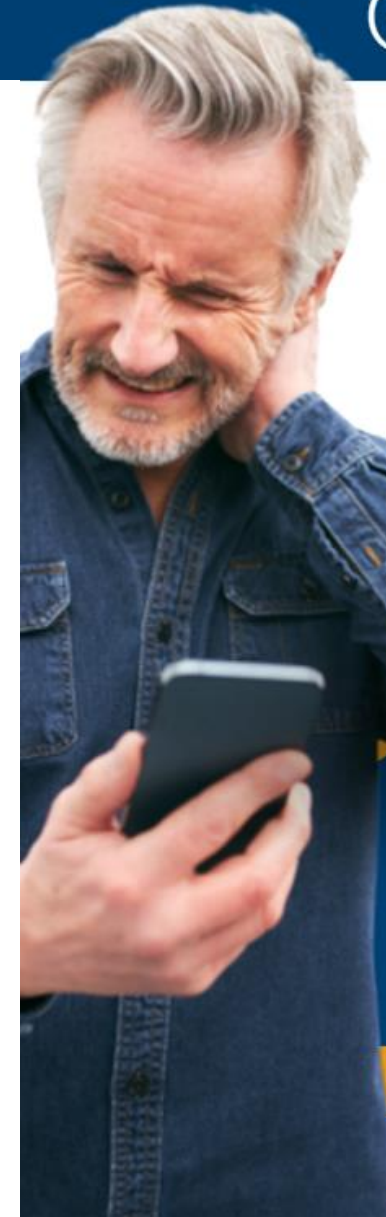

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# PACT Act: What You Need to Know & New Eligibility

- **Expands VA health care** and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic substances.
  - Adds 20+ more presumptive conditions for burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic exposures
  - Adds more presumptive-exposure locations for Agent Orange and radiation
  - Requires VA to provide a toxic exposure screening to every Veteran enrolled in VA health care
- **You're eligible to enroll now**—without needing to apply for disability benefits first—if you meet the basic service and discharge requirements and any of these descriptions are true for you:
  - You served in the Vietnam War, the Gulf War, Iraq, Afghanistan, or any other combat zone after 9/11, or
  - You deployed in support of the Global War on Terror, or
  - You were exposed to toxins or other hazards during military service at home or abroad
  - Specific toxins and hazards include burn pits, sand and dust, particulates, oil well or sulfur fires, chemicals, radiation, warfare agents, depleted uranium, herbicides, and other occupational hazards.

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# PACT Act: Changes Effective March 5, 2024

## New Eligibility:

- Veterans who participated in a toxic exposure risk activity (TERA), as defined by law at home or abroad, while serving on active duty, active duty for training, or inactive duty training.
- Veterans who were assigned to a duty station in (including airspace above) certain locations during specific periods of time:
  - On or after August 2, 1990, in the following countries: Bahrain, Iraq, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Somalia, or the United Arab Emirates
  - On or after September 11, 2001, in the following countries: Afghanistan, Djibouti, Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Yemen, Uzbekistan, or any other country determined relevant by VA. (**Note:** VA has not determined any other country relevant at this time.)
- Veterans who were deployed in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, Operation Freedom's Sentinel, Operation Iraqi Freedom, Operation New Dawn, Operation Inherent Resolve, and Resolute Support Mission.
- If you meet these criteria, you may be **immediately eligible for VA care.**



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# PACT Act: TERA Examples

## Toxic Exposure Risk Activities (TERA):

- Air pollutants (burn pits, sand, dust, particulates, oil well fires, sulfur fires);
- Chemicals (pesticides, herbicides, depleted uranium with embedded shrapnel, contaminated water)
- Occupational hazards (asbestos, industrial solvents, lead, paints including chemical agent resistant coating, firefighting foams, fuels, vibration, noise);
- Radiation (nuclear weapons handling, maintenance and detonation, radioactive material, calibration and measurement sources, X-rays, radiation from military occupational exposure);
- Warfare agents (nerve agents, chemical and biological weapons)

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# PACT Act: What You Need to Know & New Eligibility



## Conditions Presumed to be Service-Connected

As of August 10, 2022, a long list of new conditions are presumed to be service-connected due to various in-service toxic exposures. **APPLY NOW** at [VA.gov/PACT](https://va.gov/PACT) to expedite your claim and benefits.

- Asthma (diagnosed after service)
- Brain cancer
- Chronic bronchitis
- Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD)
- Chronic rhinitis
- Chronic sinusitis
- Constrictive bronchiolitis or obliterative bronchiolitis
- Emphysema
- Gastrointestinal cancer of any type
- Glioblastoma
- Granulomatous disease
- Head cancer of any type
- High blood pressure (hypertension)
- Interstitial lung disease (ILD)
- Kidney cancer
- Lymphomatic cancer of any type
- Lymphoma of any type
- Melanoma
- Monoclonal gammopathy of undetermined significance (MGUS)
- Neck cancer
- Pancreatic cancer
- Pleuritis
- Pulmonary fibrosis
- Reproductive cancer of any type
- Respiratory (breathing-related) cancer of any type
- Sarcoidosis

- 24/7 access to care – Emergency Room in Marion, Tele-Emergency Room always available



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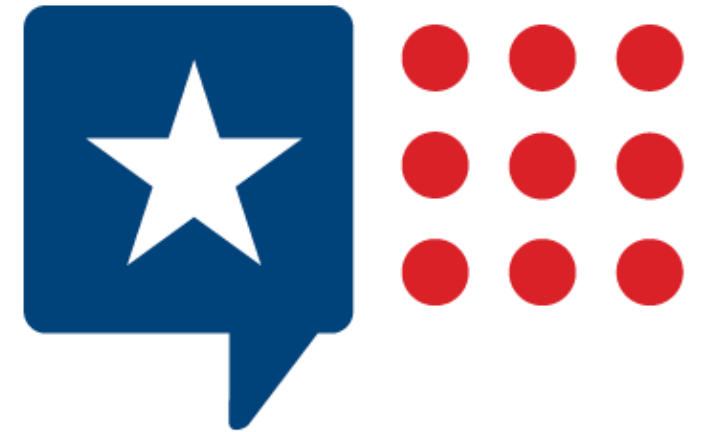


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# COMPACT Act: Get Help During Crisis

- Veterans in suicidal crisis can go to any health care facility (VA or in the community) for **free emergency health care**, including transportation costs – and receive inpatient or crisis residential care for up to 30 days, and outpatient care for up to 90 days.
- Increases access to acute suicide care to an *additional 9-million unenrolled Veterans*.
